#### VOLUNIARY ENGAGEMENT

Children and young people choose to be smolved, not least because they want to rolex, meet friends, make new relationships, have fun, and find support.

#### STARTS WHERE CHILDREN AND YOUNG PEOPLE ARE AT

Youth work starts from where children and groung people are in relation to their own values, views and principies, as well as their own personal and social space.

#### WIDEN'S HORIZONS, PROMOTES PARTICIPATION

Youth work seeks to go beyond where children, and young perspectation to wider their horizons, promote perspectation and invelt social commitment, in particular by encouraging them to be citical and creative in their responses to their experience and the world amount them.

#### RESPECTS AND VALUES CHILDREN AND YOUNS PEOPLE

Youth work treats children and young people with respect, valuing each individual and their differences as weing an promoting the acceptance and understanding of others, whilst challenging oppressive behaviour and ideas.

#### CAPACITY FOR SROWTH AND CHANSE

Youth work respects and values individual differences by supporting and strengthening children and young people's belief in themselves and their capacity to grow and change through a supportive group insvorment.

#### EQUITY, DIVERSITY AND INTERDEPENDENCE

Youth work is underprinted by the principles of equity, diversity and interdependence.

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#### POSITIVE RELATIONSHIPS AND INCLUSION

#### PARTNERS IN LEARNING


Touth work recognises the young person as a partner in a learning process, complementing formal education, promoting their access to learning opportunities which enable them to fusible their potential.



- Identify effective pathways for engagement with children and young people at risk






# The Voice of Children and Young People





#### Wellbeing for All


