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## SECTION 1.0 DEMOGRAPHICS AND DEPRIVATION

### 1.1 Demographics

#### Lisburn and Castlereagh City Council

Lisburn and Castlereagh is a local government district in Northern Ireland. It was created in April 2015 following the merger of most of the City of Lisburn with the Borough of Castlereagh. The district takes in many of the outer suburbs of Belfast.

The estimated population of Lisburn and Castlereagh local government district in 2021 is 148,965 people, of which 73,255 (49.18%) are male and 75,710 (50.82%) are female. The population aged 25 years and under is 45,623 people which equates to 30.63% of the total population, with the NI average being 32.6%. The breakdown of the figures shows that 23,801 (52.17%) of the young people aged 25 and under were male and 21,822 (47.83%) of the young people were female.

Chart 1 – Total Population in Local Government District Compared to NI by Gender (Aged 0 – 25 years)

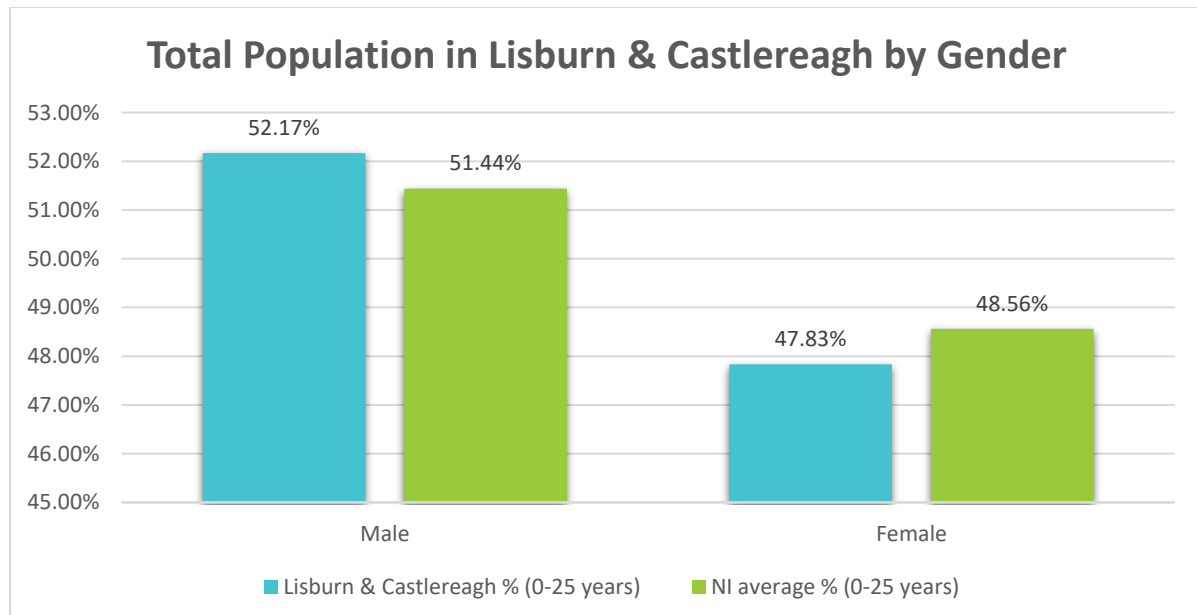


Chart 2 – Projected Population by Gender 2021 – 2030 (Aged 0 – 25 Years)

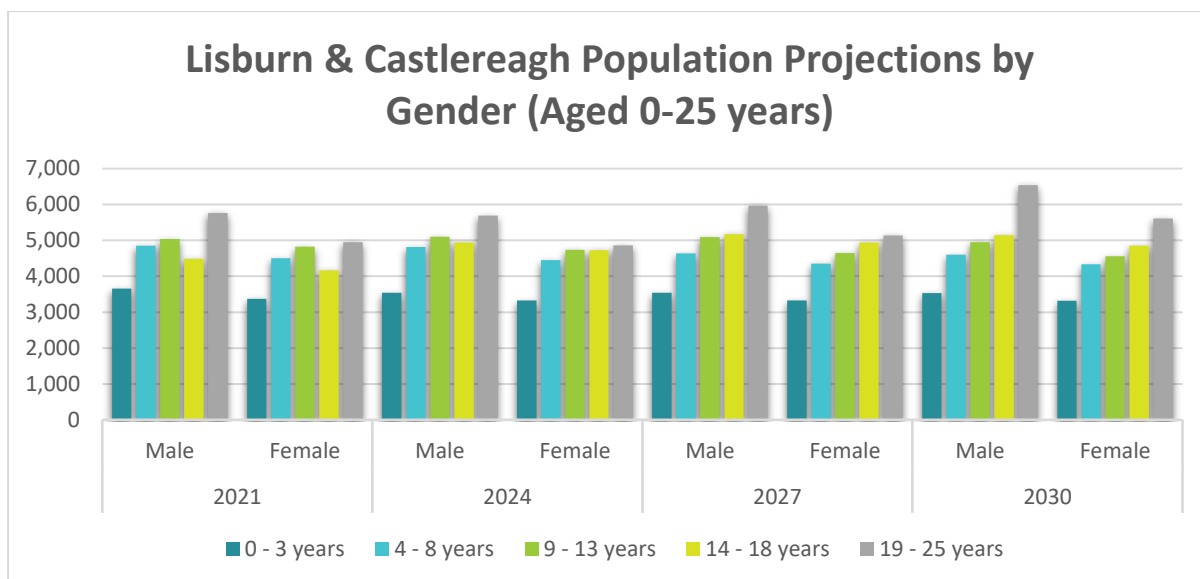

Chart 3 – Projected Population by Age Bands 2021 – 2030 (Aged 0 – 25 Years)

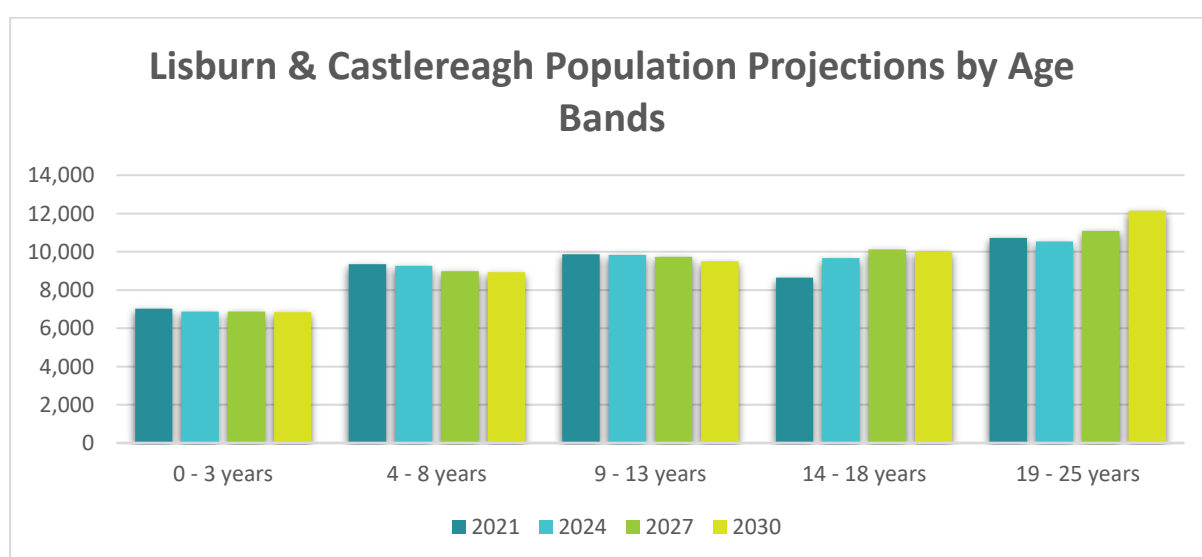

Chart 4 – Number of Young People Living in Deprived Areas in Local Government District Compared to NI (Aged 4-25 years)

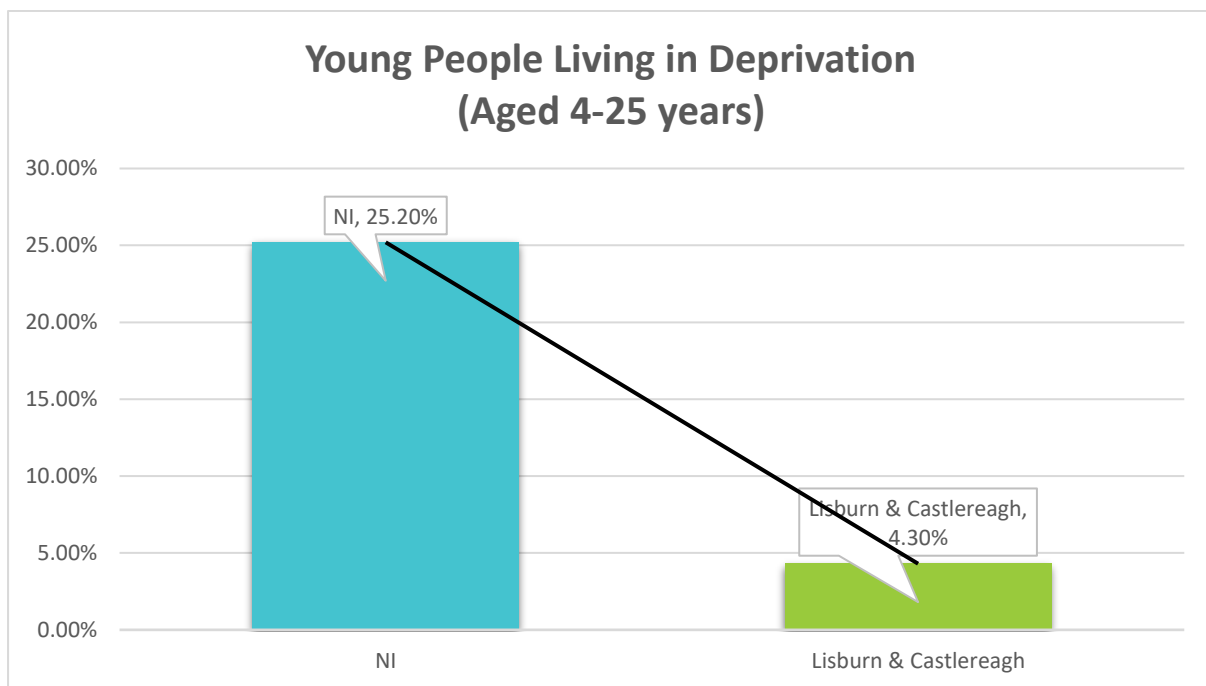

Chart 5 – Percentage of Young People Living in Deprived Areas (Aged 4-25 years)

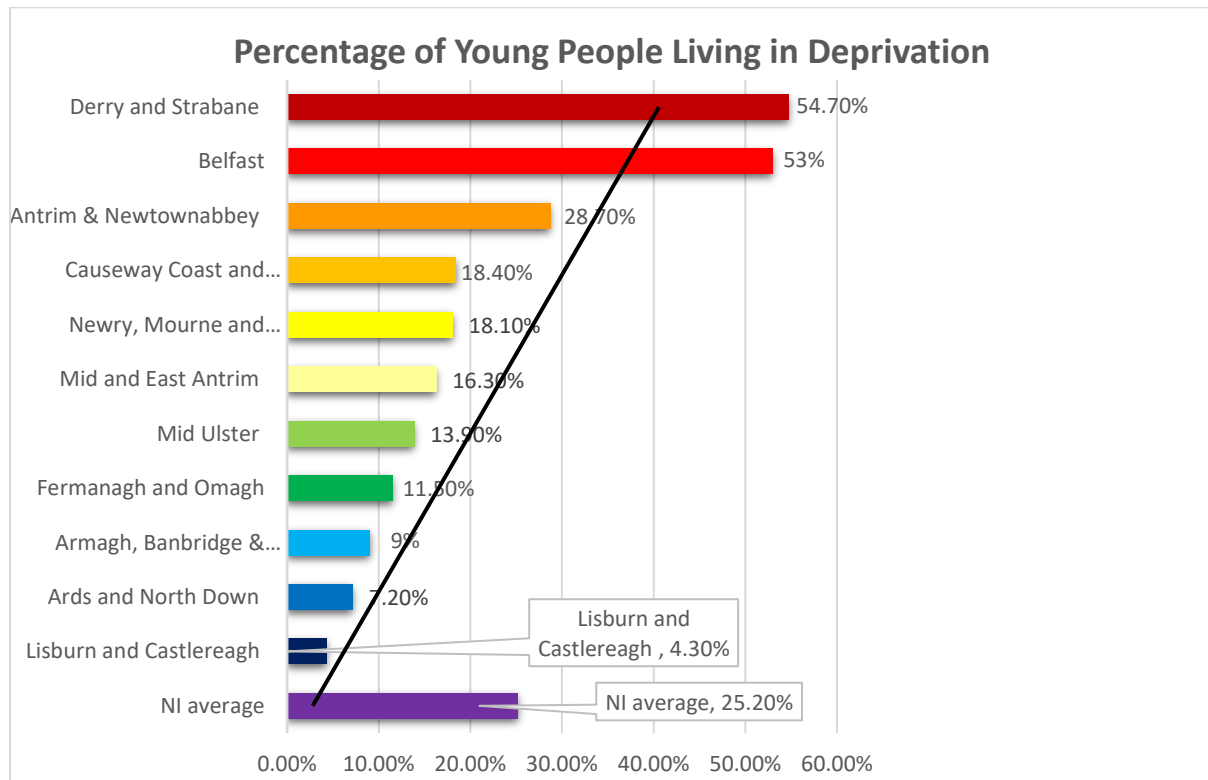

Chart 6 – Percentage of Young People Living in Rural Areas in Local Government District Compared to NI (Aged 4-25 years)

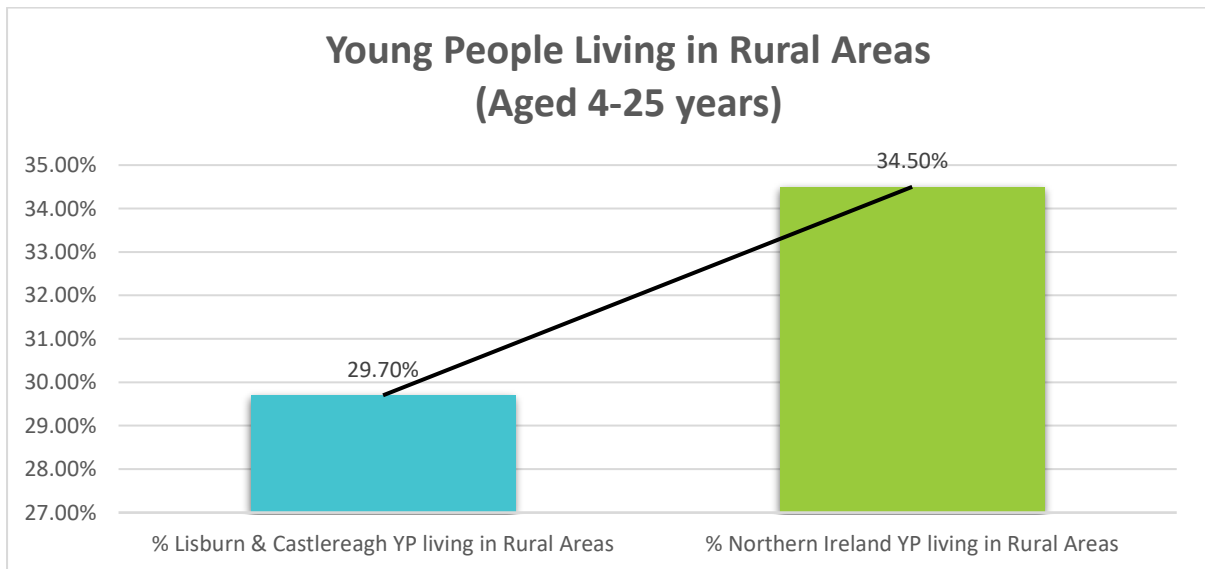


Chart 7 – Percentage of Young People Living in Rural Areas District (Aged 4-25 years)

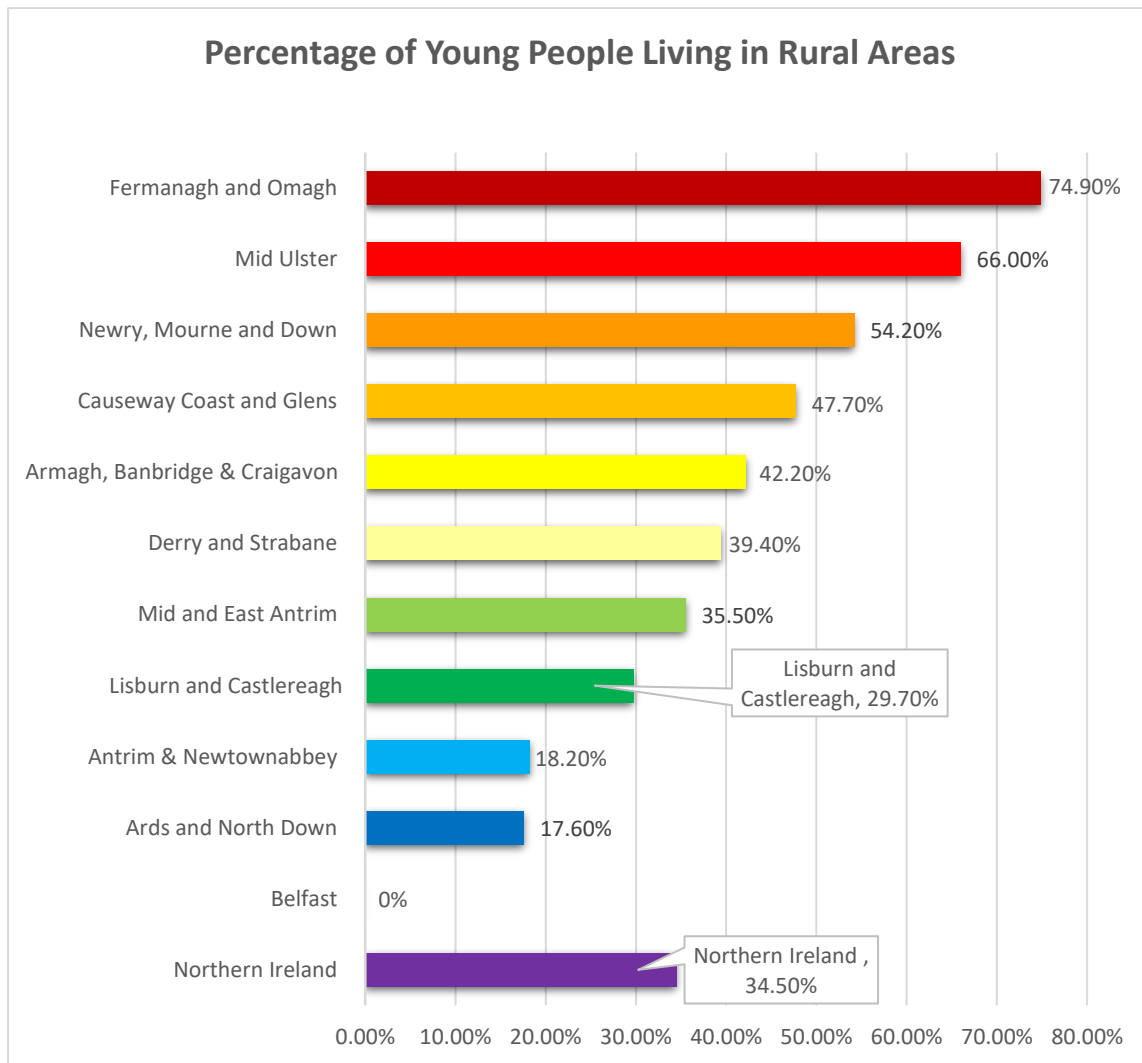

#### 1.4 Neighbourhood Renewal Areas Northern Ireland 2021

A Neighbourhood Renewal Area is defined as an area in the most top 10% deprived areas of Northern Ireland based upon the Multiple Deprivation Measures as identified by the Northern Ireland Statistics and Research Agency (NISRA). Neighbourhood Renewal Areas (NRAs) are neighbourhoods identified as experiencing the most severe multiple deprivation and have been chosen to receive support under the Department for Communities People and Place strategy for Neighbourhood Renewal

Northern Ireland has a total of 36 Neighbourhood renewal areas. There are 15 in Belfast, 6 in the North West (including 4 in Derry) and 15 situated in other towns and cities across Northern Ireland.

Chart 8 – Percentage of Benefit Claimants in Local Government District

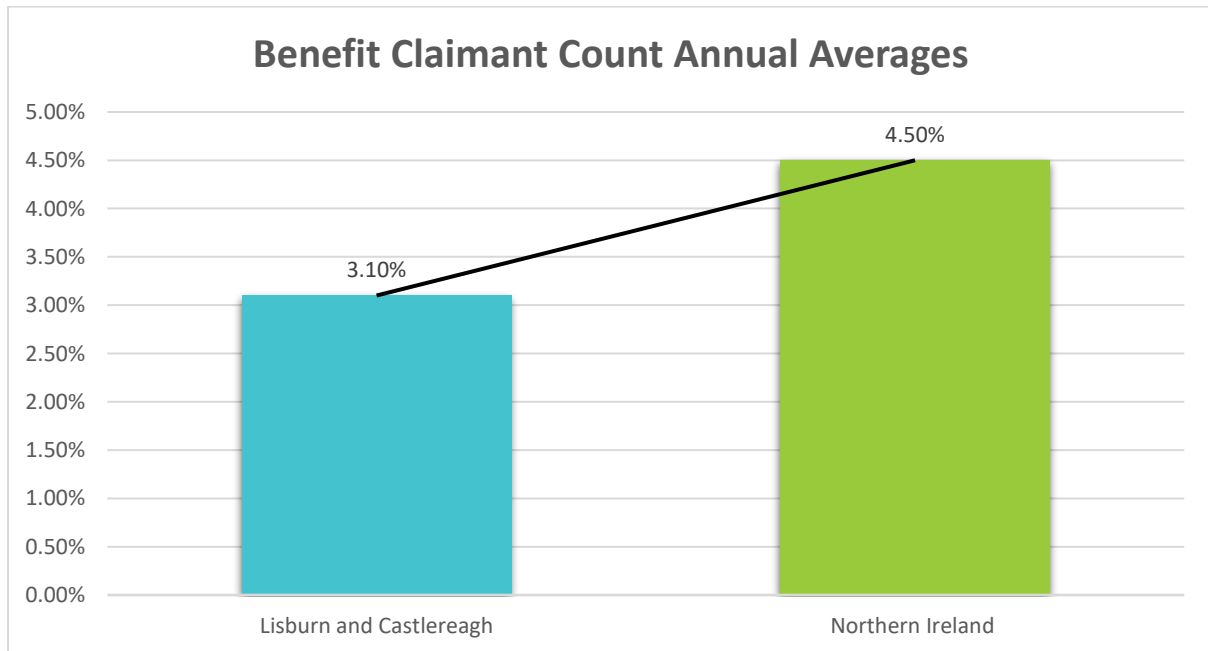
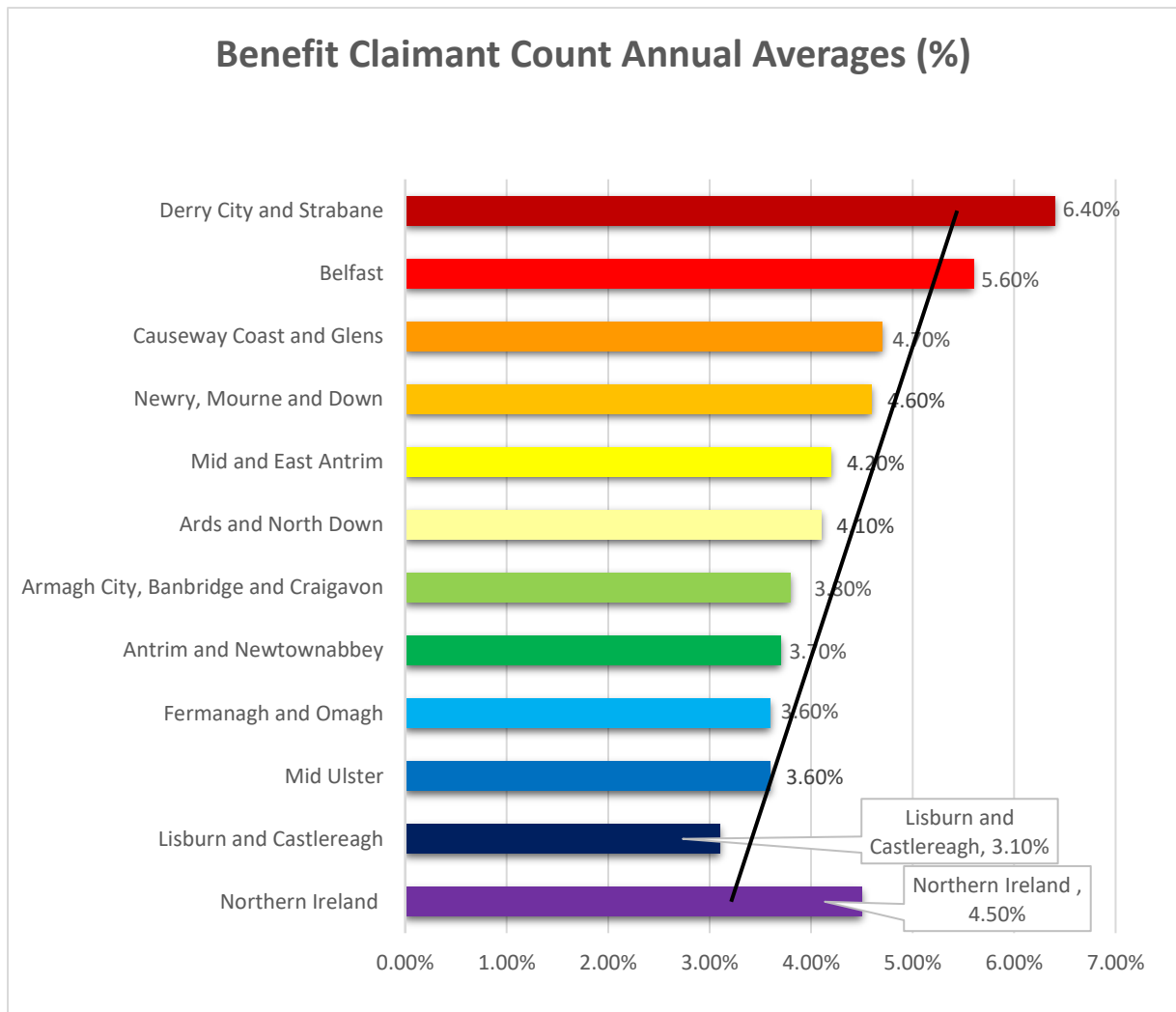


Chart 9 – Total Percentage of Benefit Claimants

Chart 10 – Benefit Claimants Annual Averages 2017 – 2020 (Aged 18 – 24)

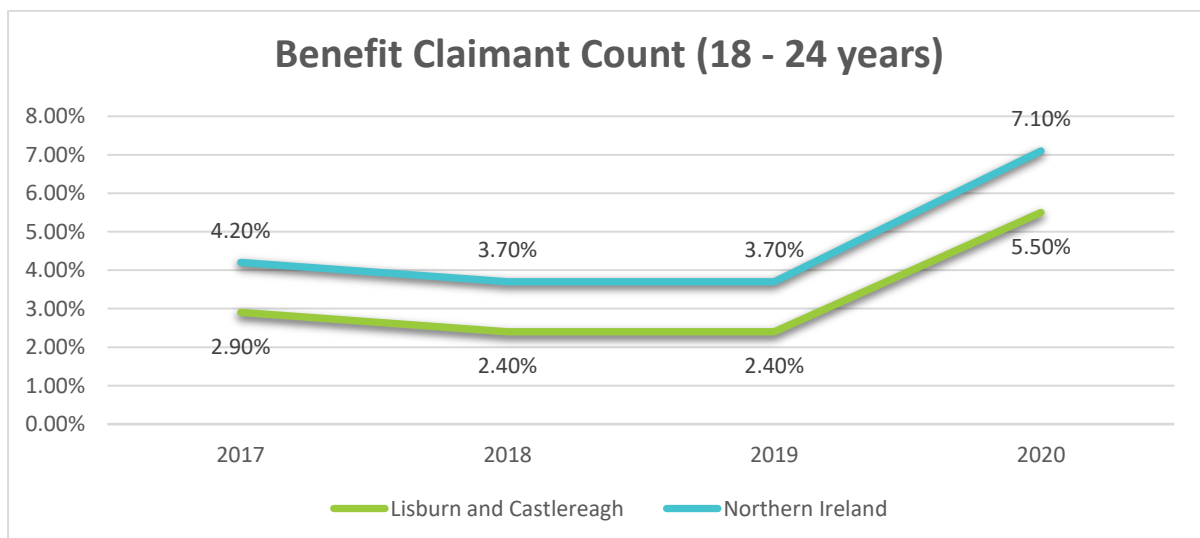

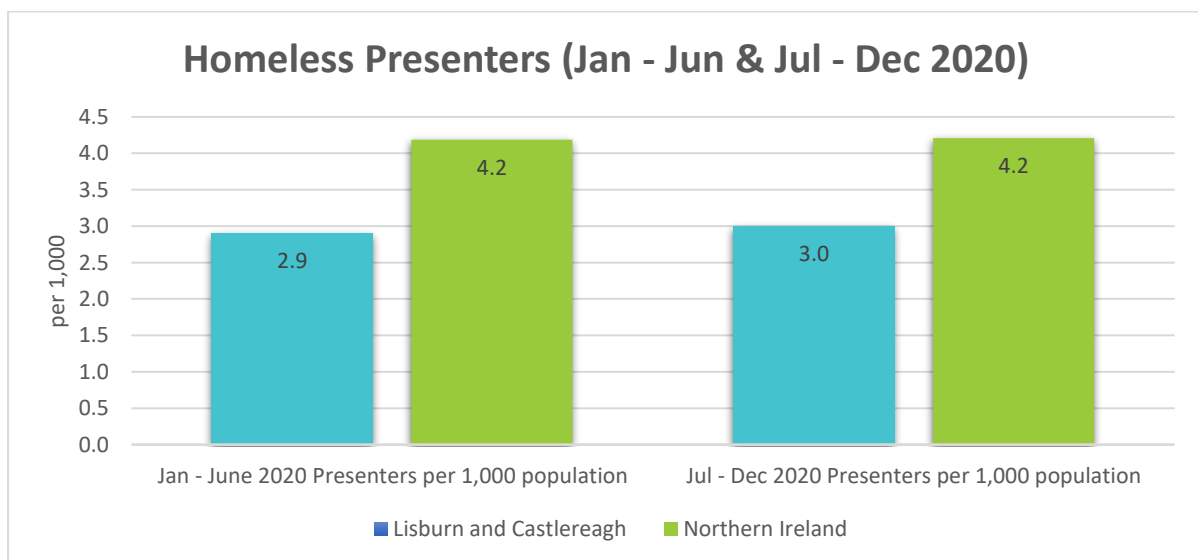

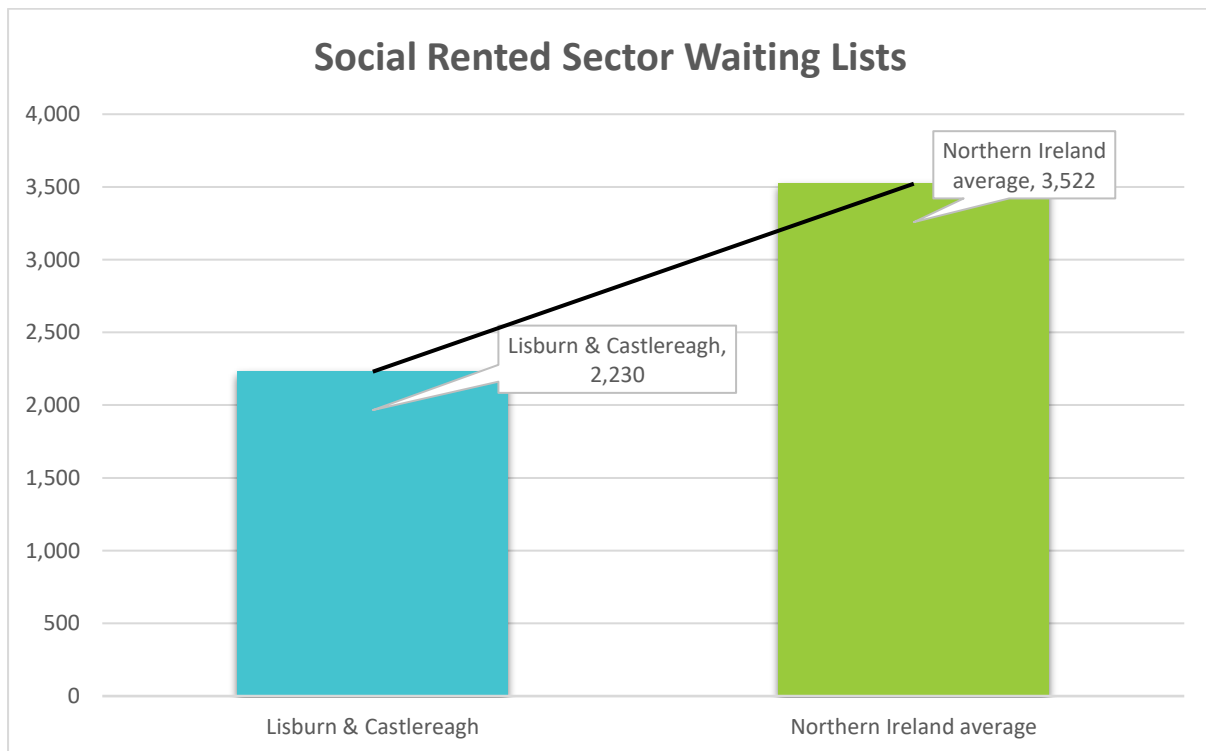

## 1.8 Council League Tables

- Claimant count (% of population)
- Median earnings
- Educational attainment (% pupils 5 GCSEs A\*-C inc. English and Maths)
- Pupils entitled to free school meals (%)
- Life expectancy men and women
- Households in housing stress (% of population) and empty homes (%)

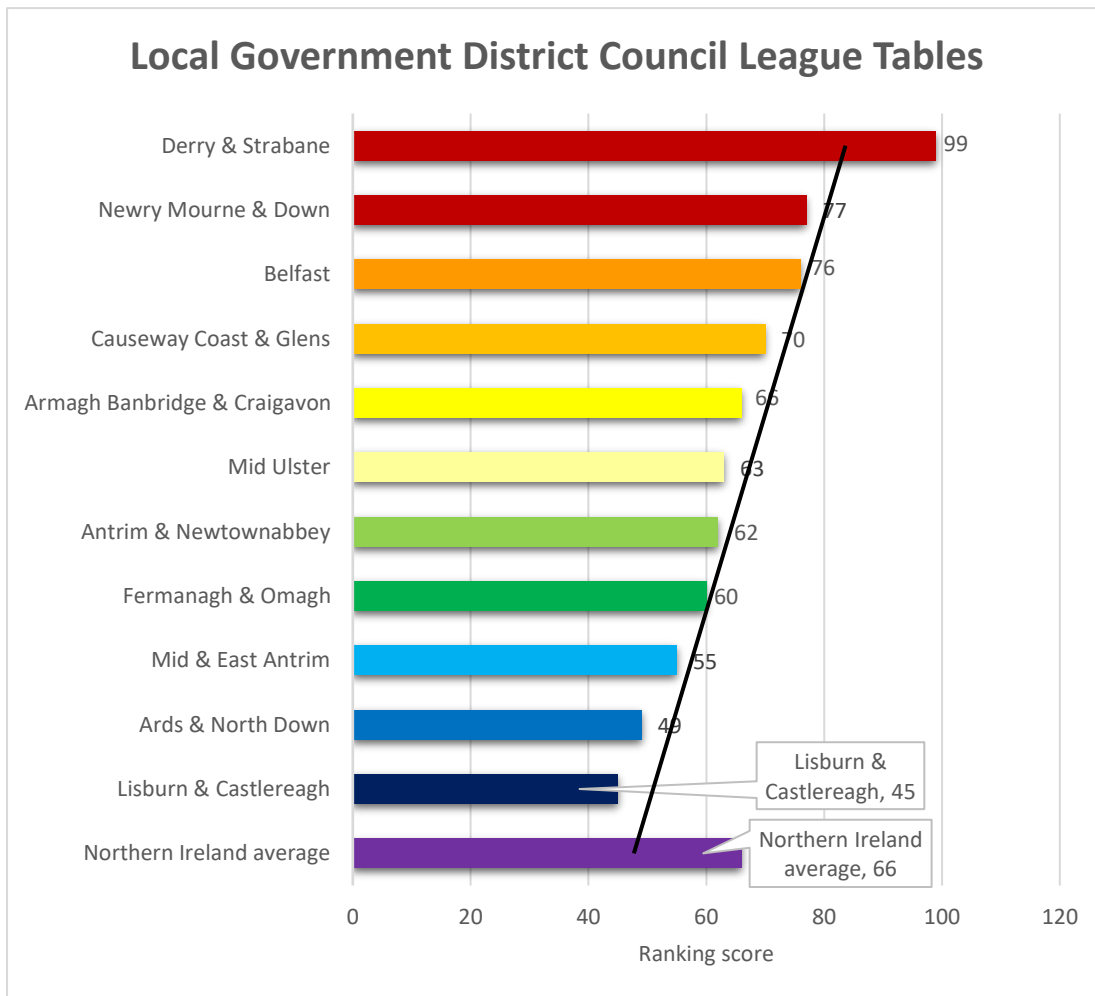
The results have been used to construct a league table, ranking each of the councils from 1 to 11 on the variables above.

### 1.9 Northern Ireland Multiple Deprivation Measures (NIMDM)

The Northern Ireland Multiple Deprivation Measure was published in November 2017, identifying small area concentrations of multiple deprivation across Northern Ireland. The results are presented by small areas known as Super Output Areas (SOAs). Northern Ireland is divided into 890 of these SOAs which are ranked according to deprivation using seven domains, or distinct types which in composite form is known as the Multiple Deprivation Measure. These are:

- Income Domain
- Employment Domain
- Health Deprivation and Disability Domain
- Education, Skills and Training Domain
- Access to Services Domain
- Living Environment Domain
- Crime and Disorder Domain

1. The NI Multiple Deprivation Measure, and

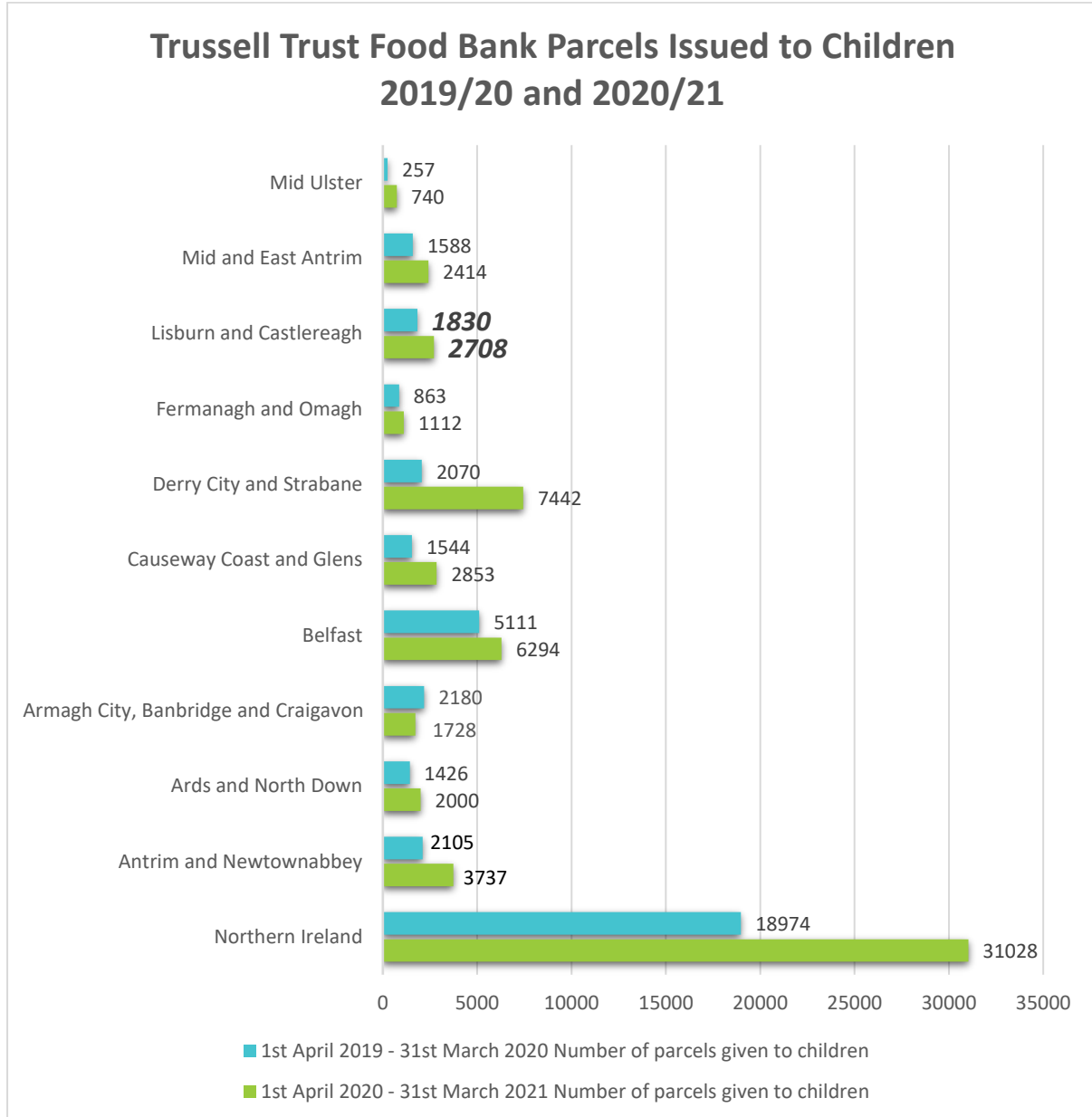

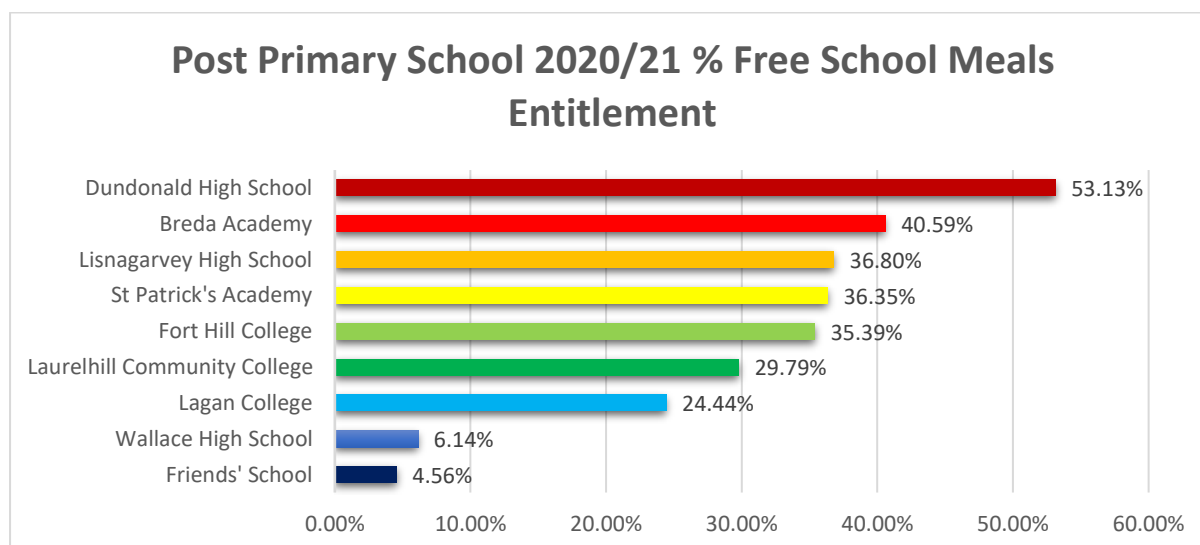

Chart 1 – Average Distance of Population Proximity to Nearest Dentist in Miles

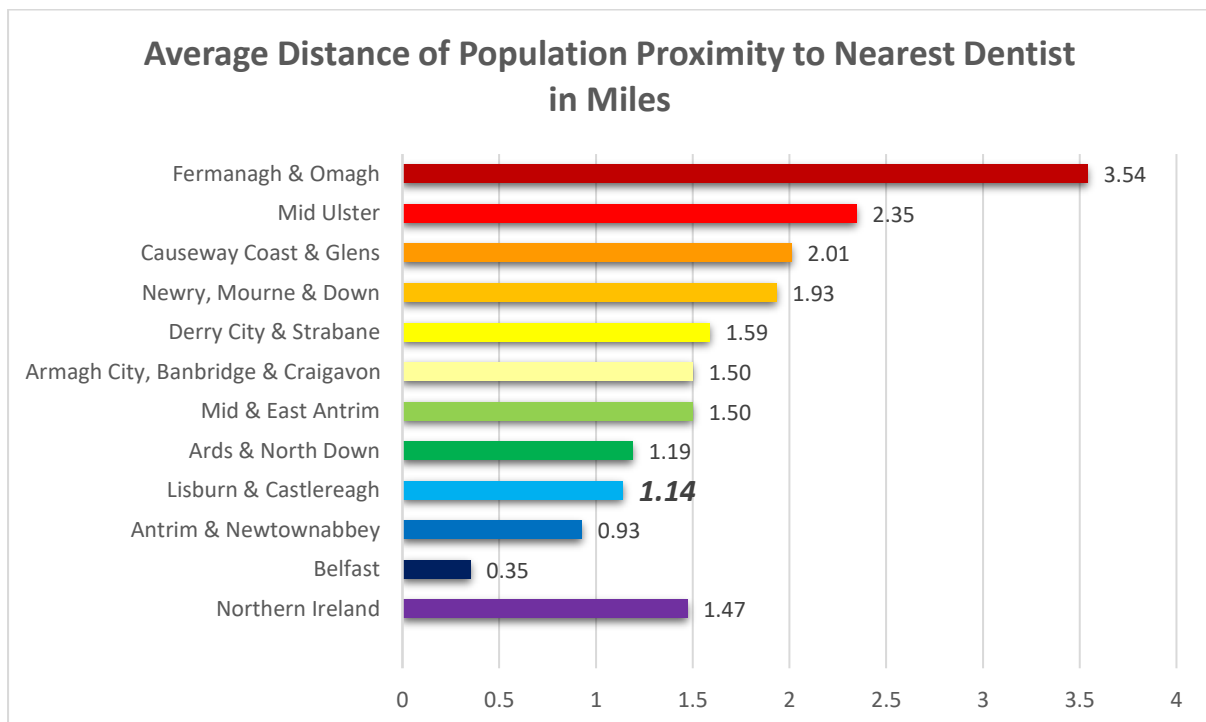
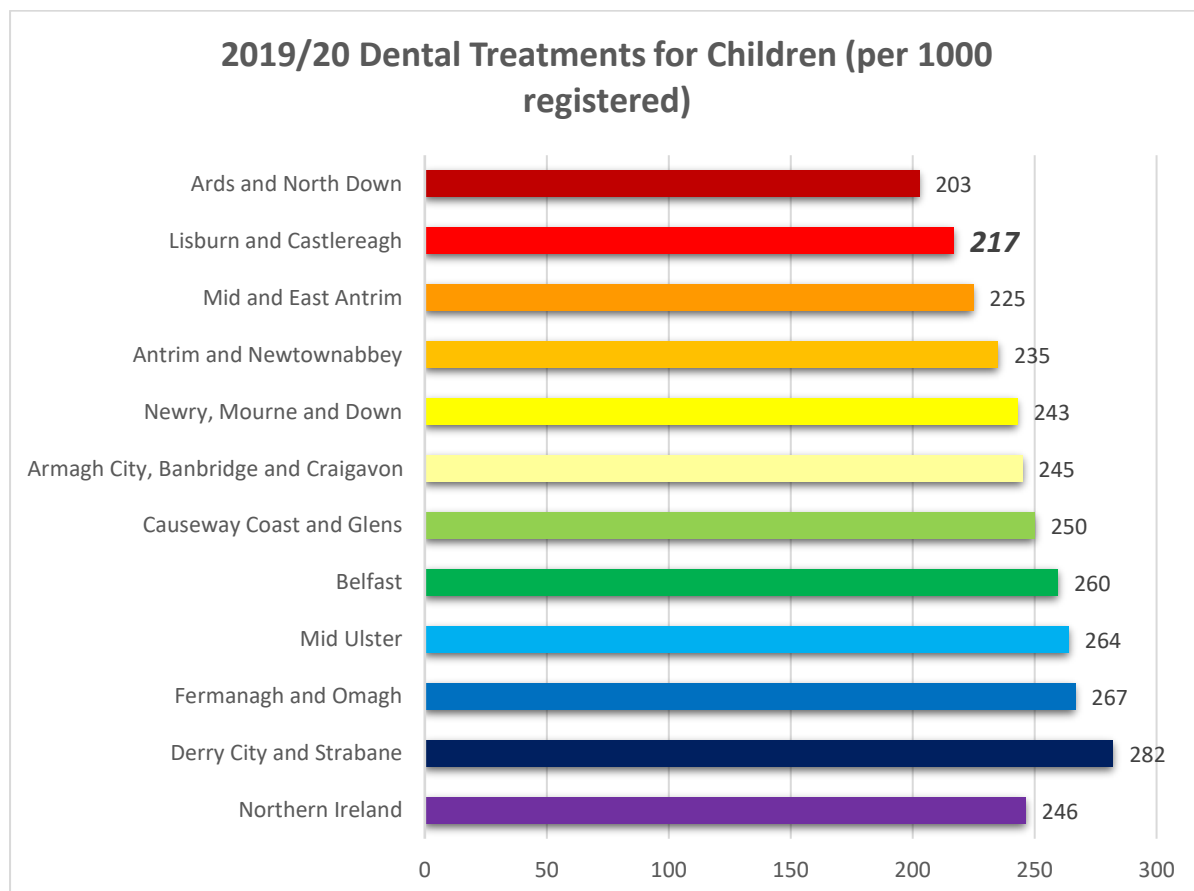

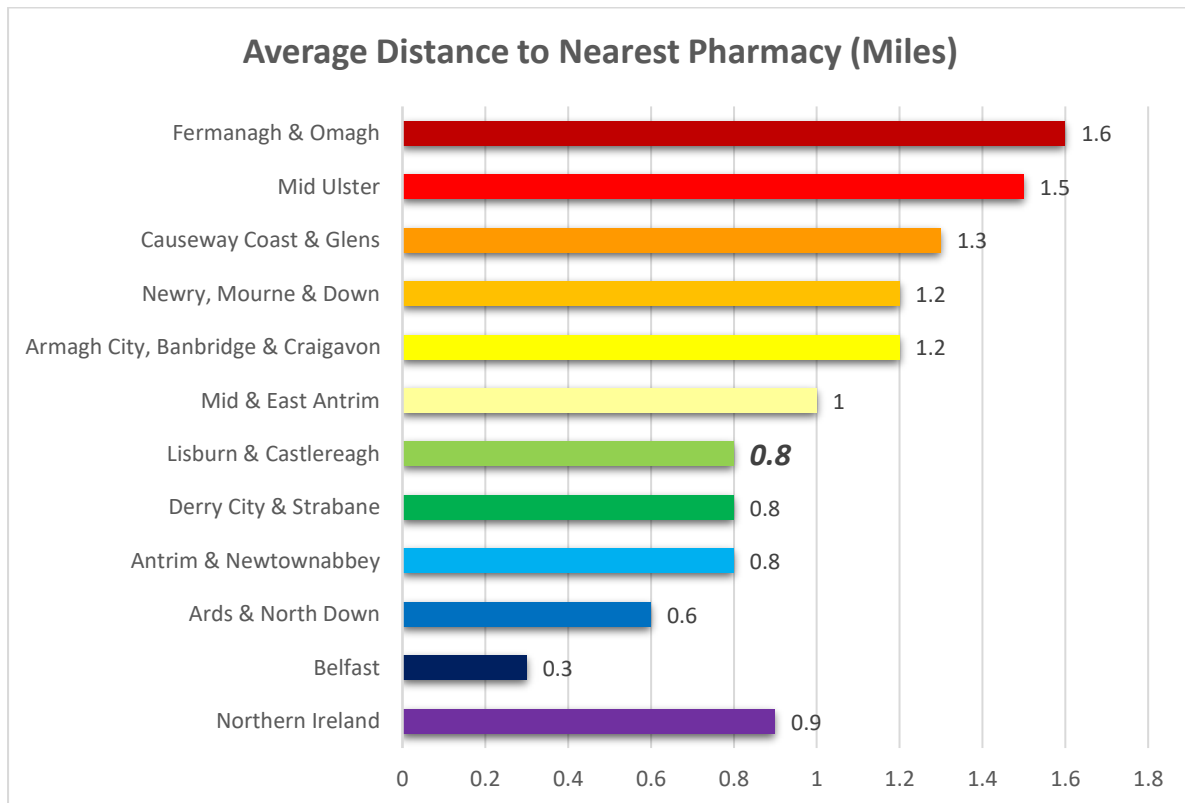

Chart 2 – Average Distance to Nearest Pharmacy in Miles



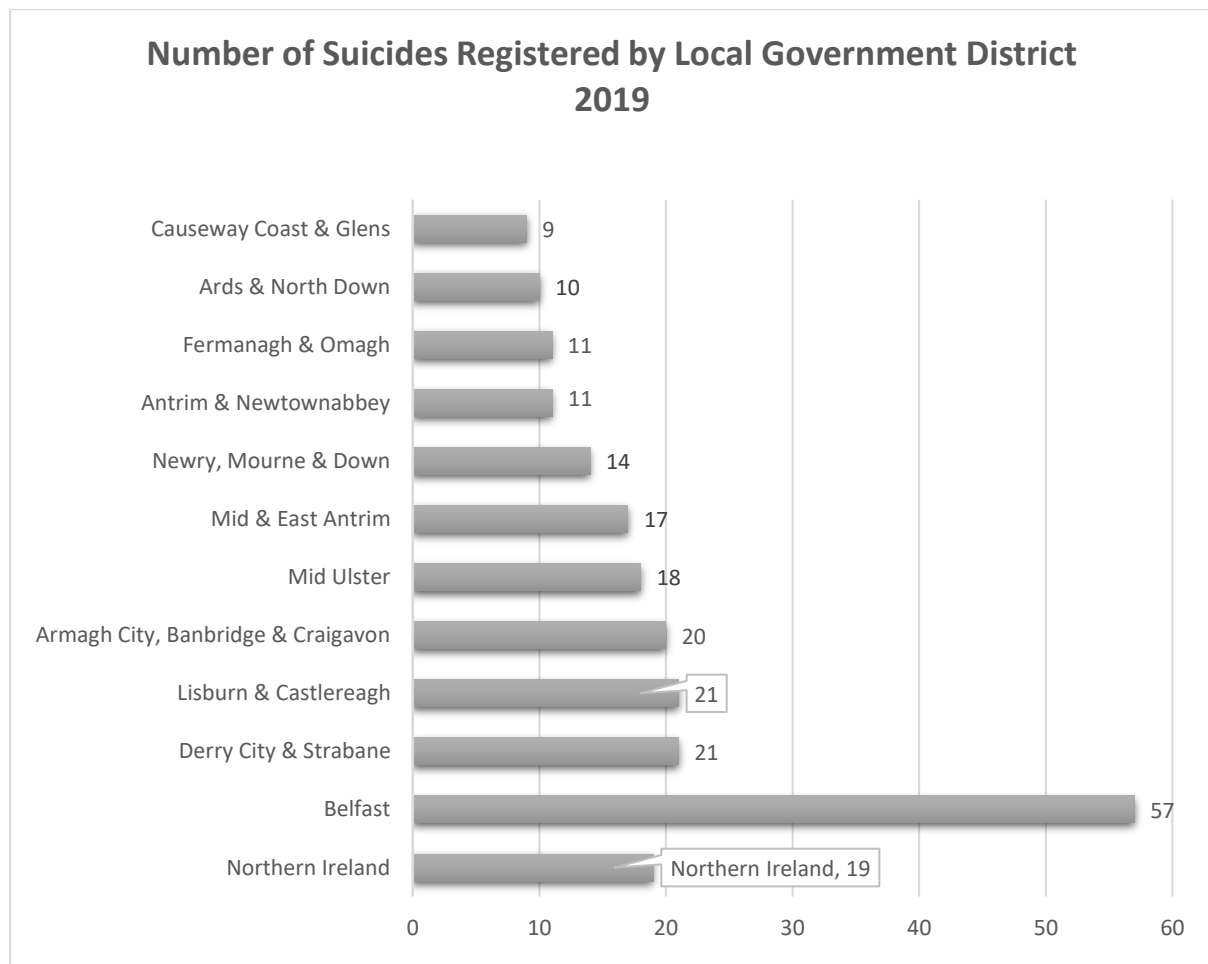

Chart 3 – Number of Suicide Deaths Registered by Local Government District (2019)

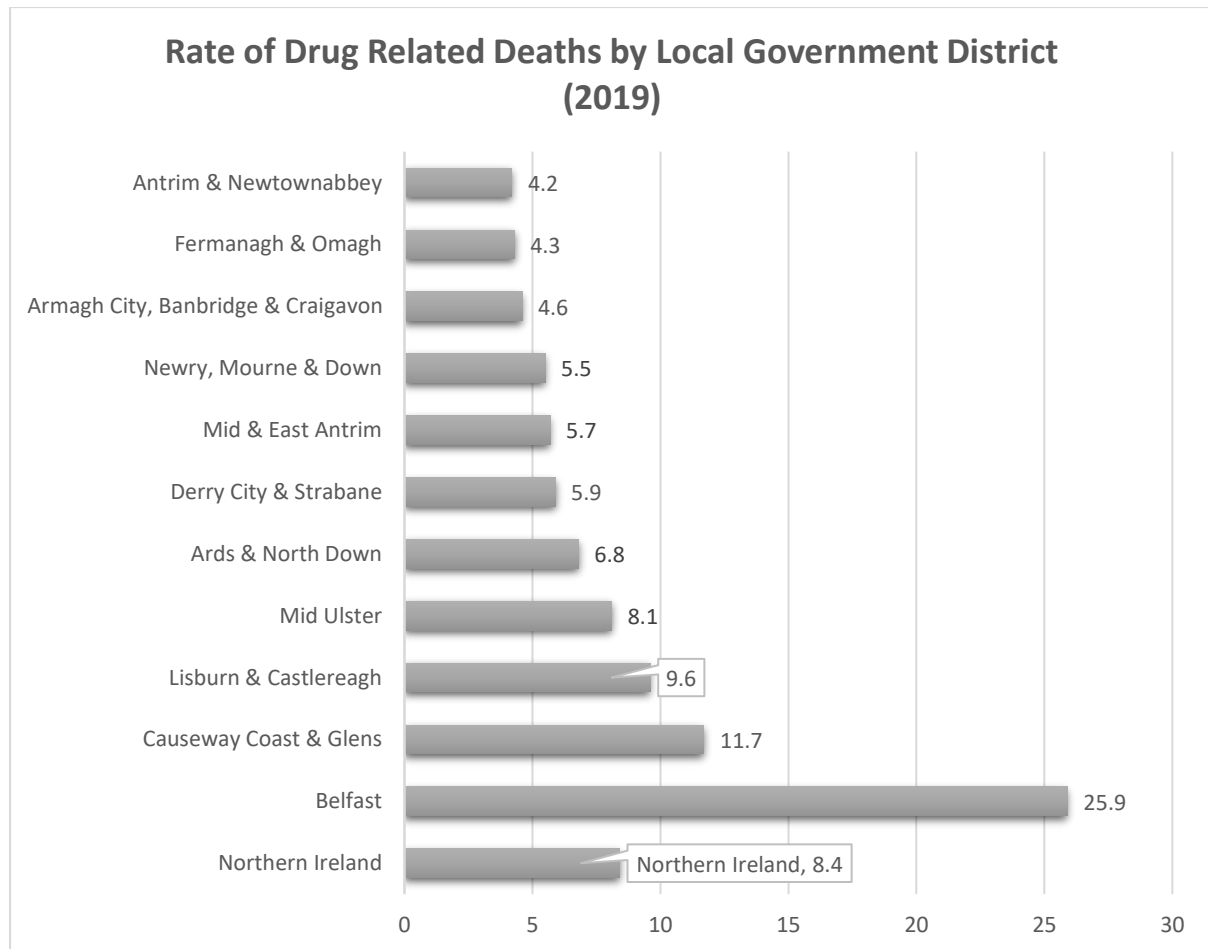

Chart 4 - Number of Drug Related Deaths by Local Government District 2019 (per 100,000)

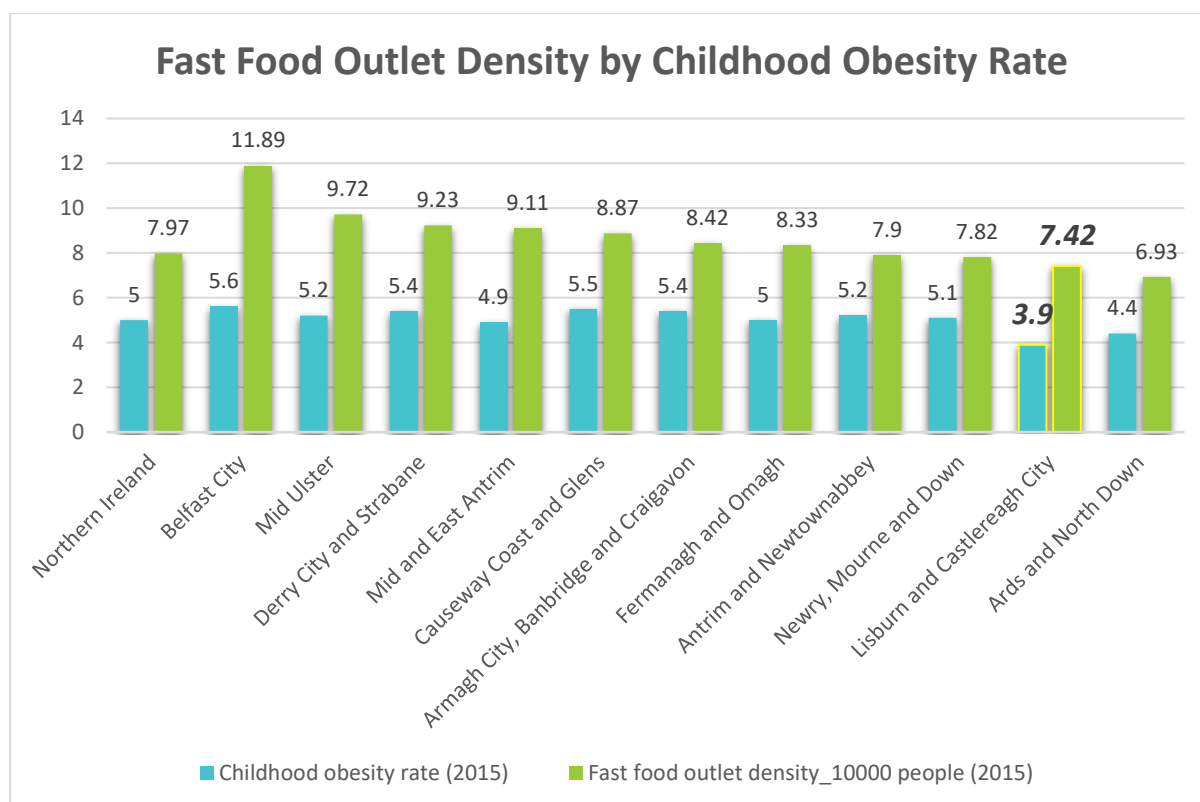

Chart 1 – Sectarian Incidents by Policing District (2020)

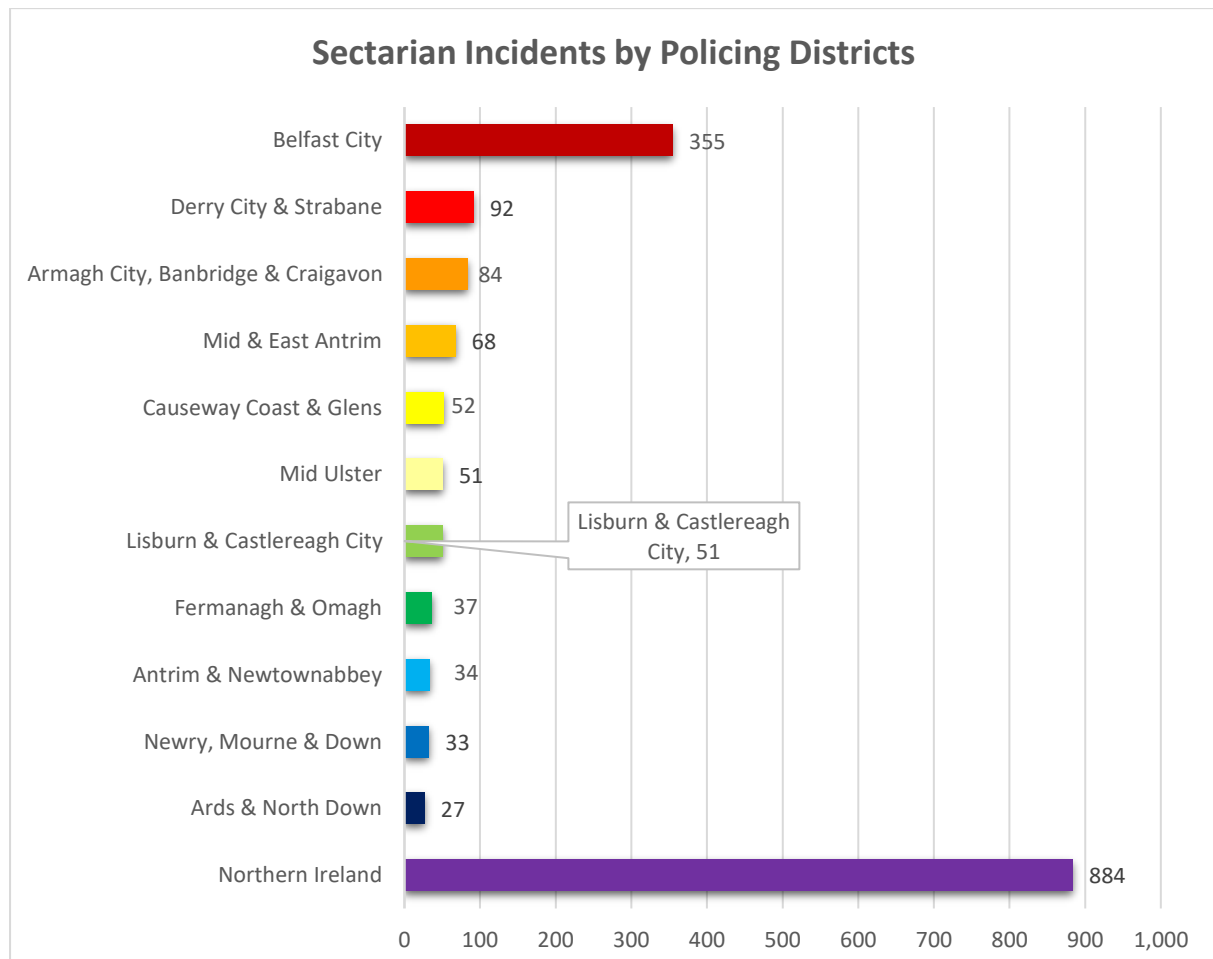
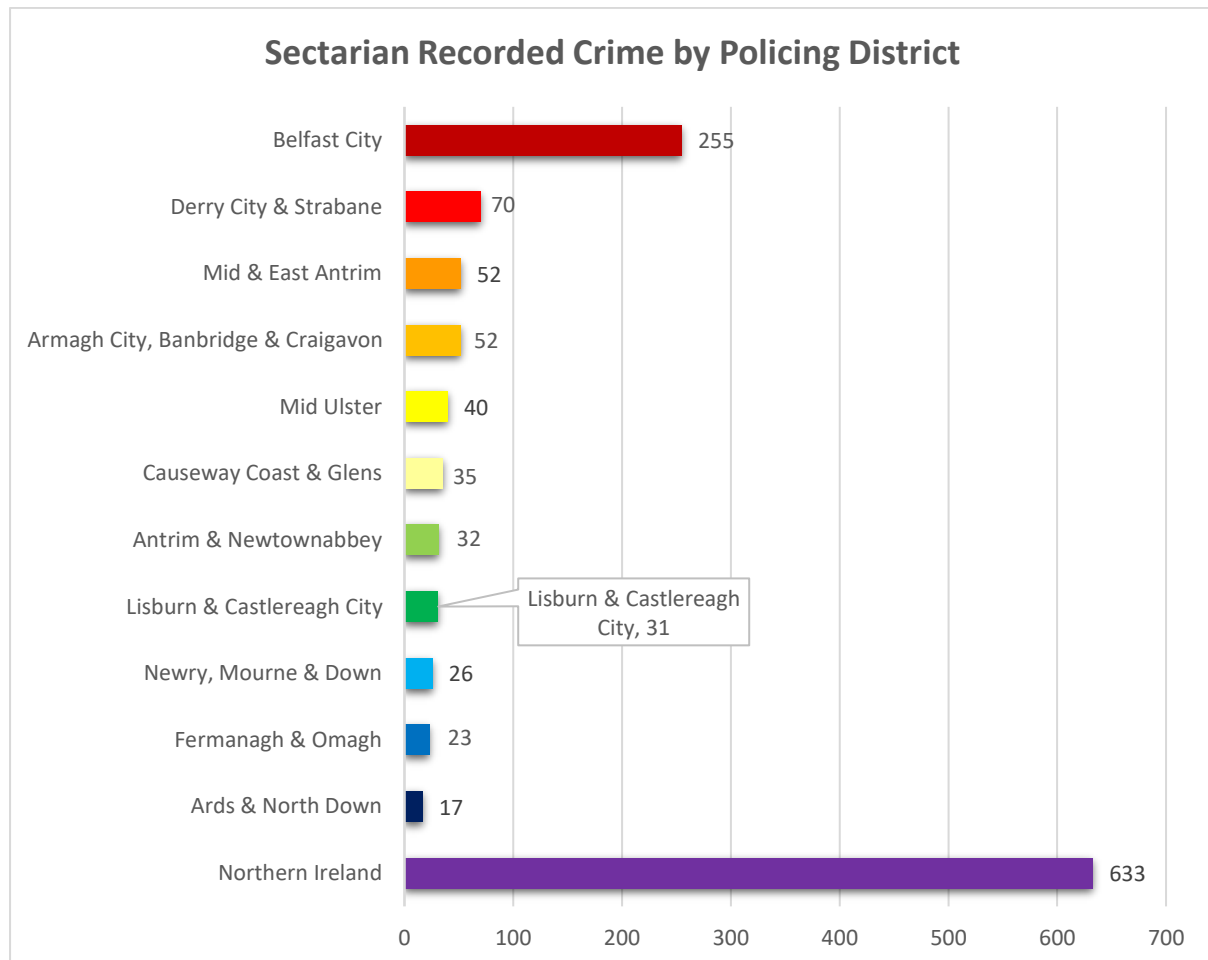

Chart 3 – Racial Incidents by Policing District (2020)

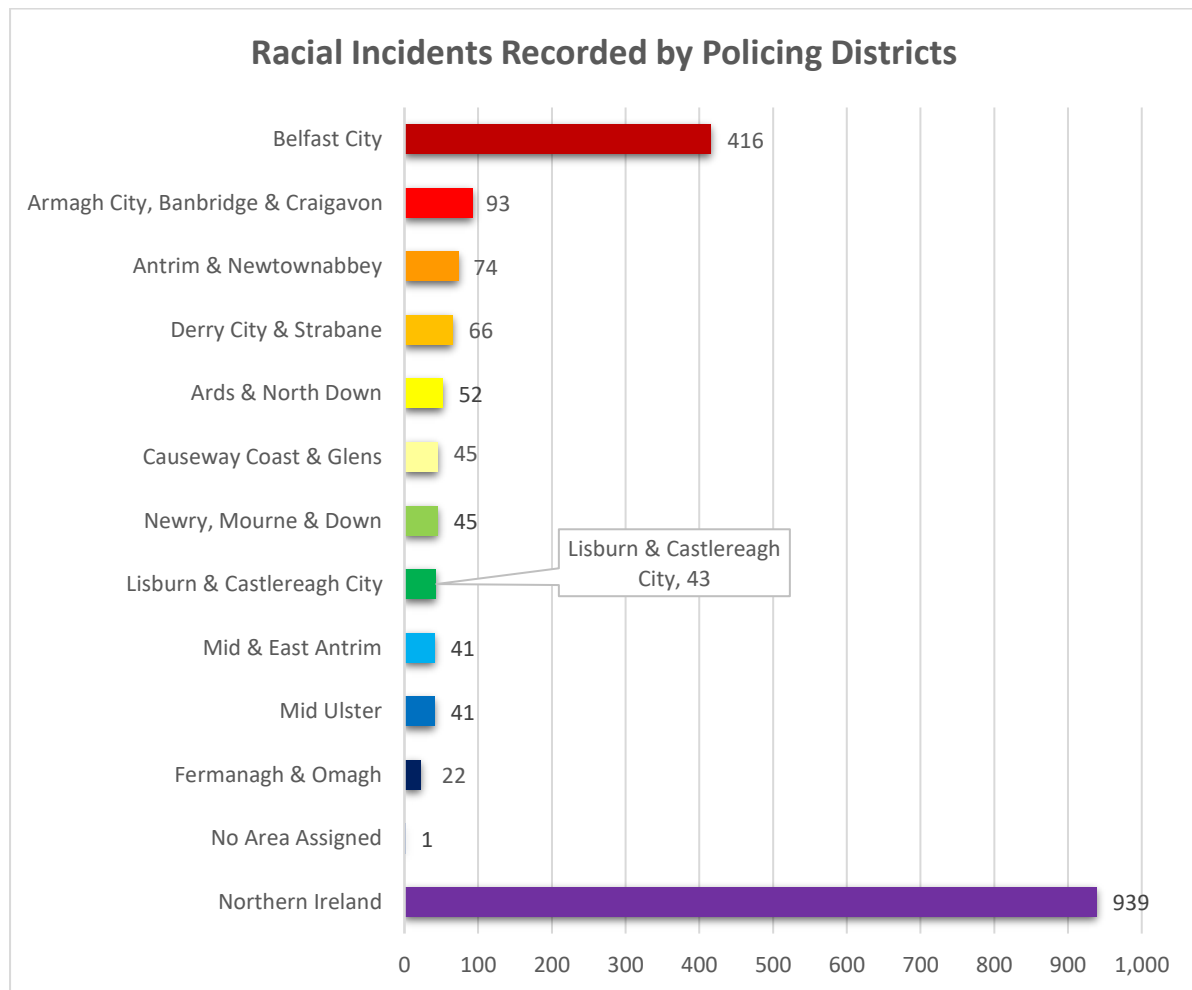

Chart 4 – Racial Recorded Crime by Policing District (2020)

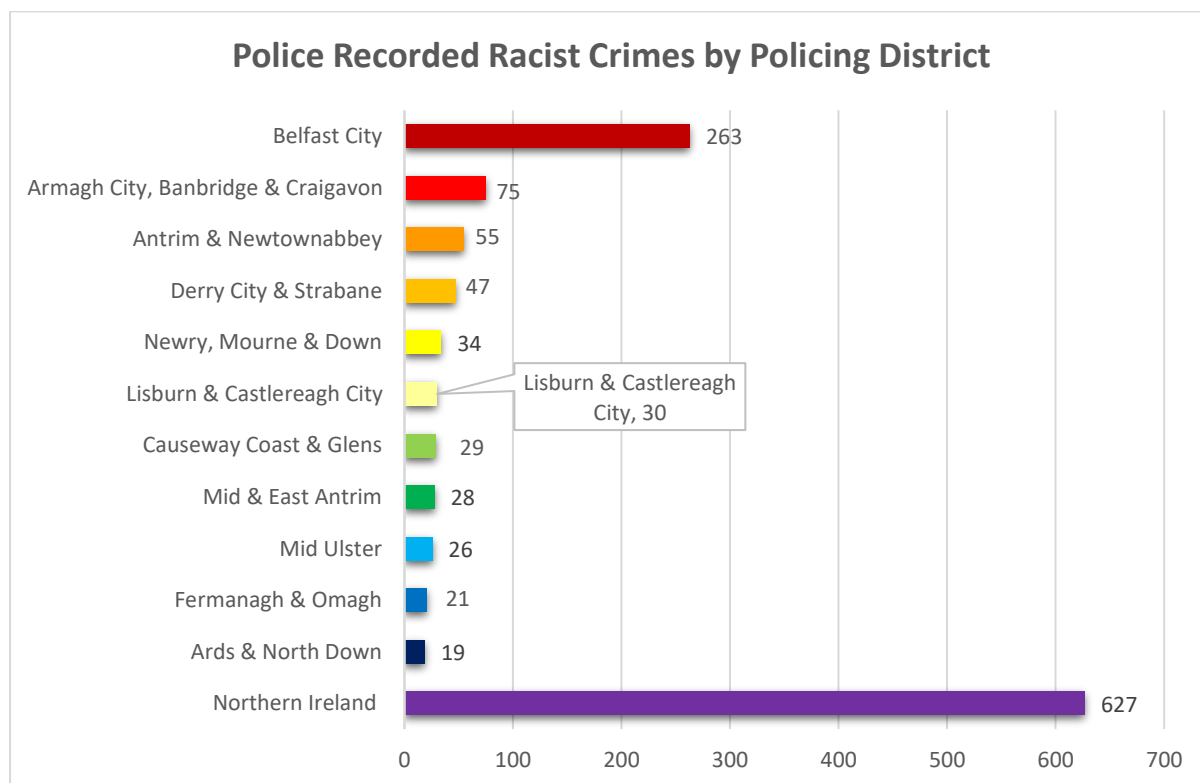
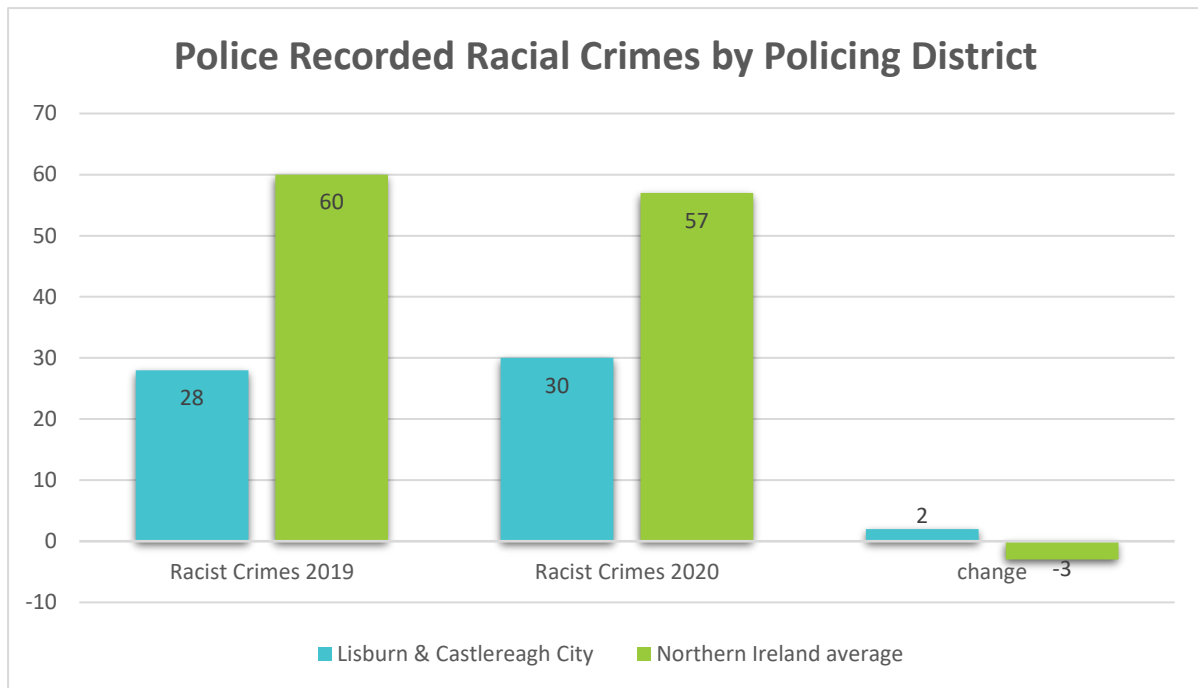

Chart 6 – Homophobic Incidents by Policing District (January – December 2020)

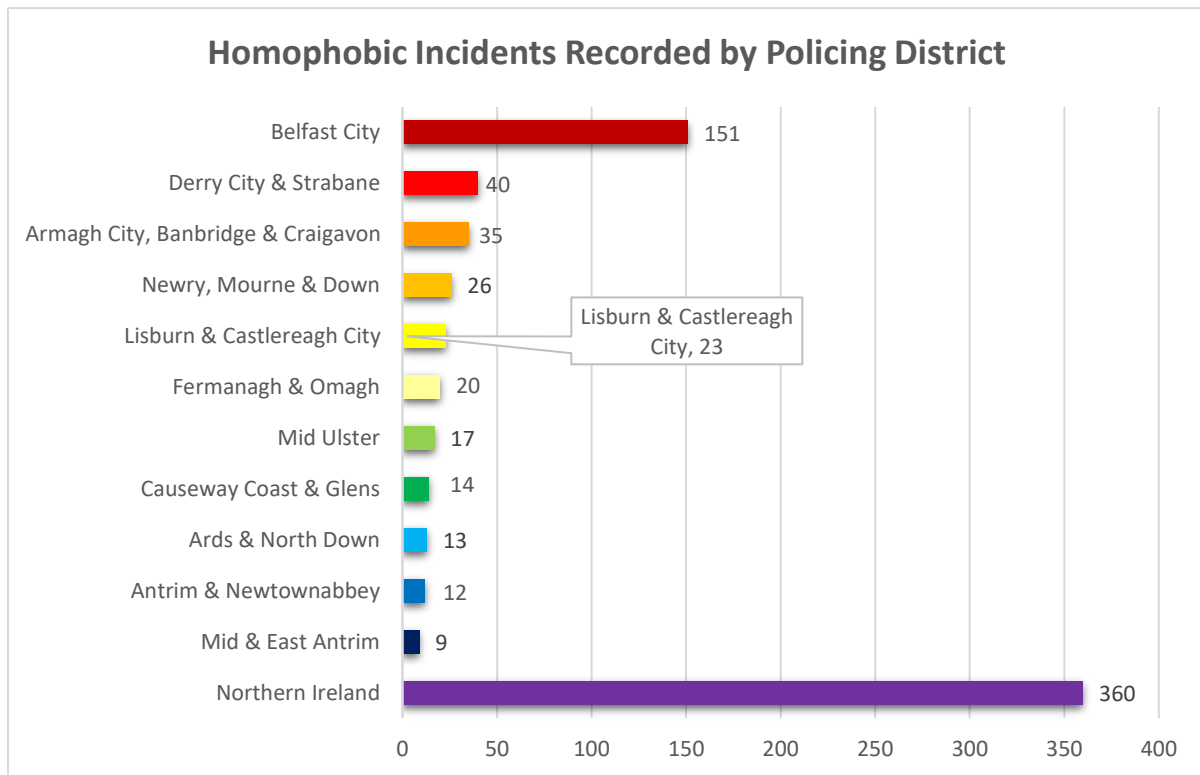

Chart 7 – Homophobic Recorded Crime by Policing District (January – December 2020)

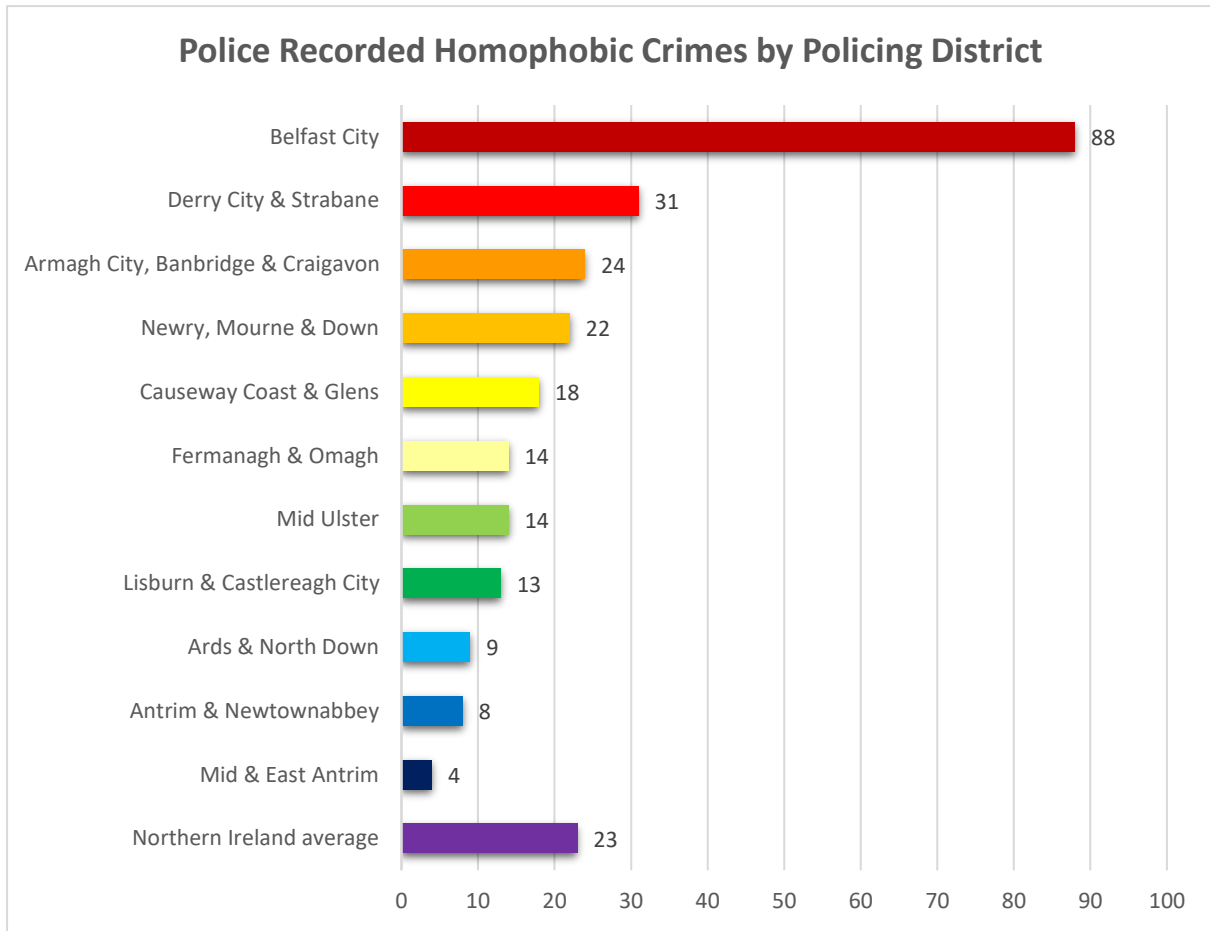
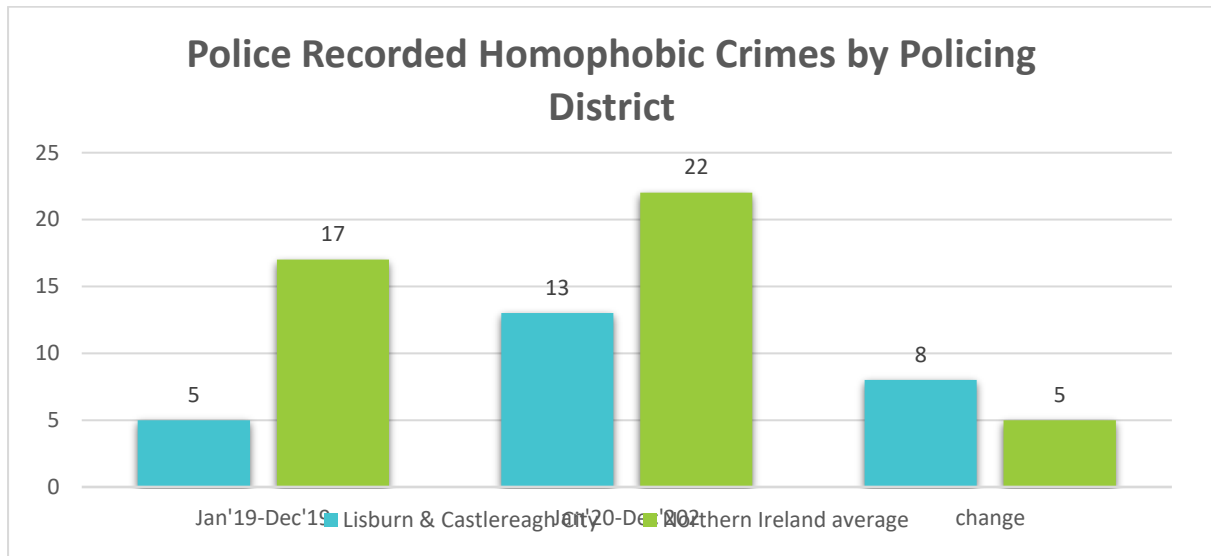

Chart 9 – Comparison of Anti-Social Behaviour Incidents by 12 Months Period to 31 January 2021 and Previous 12 Months

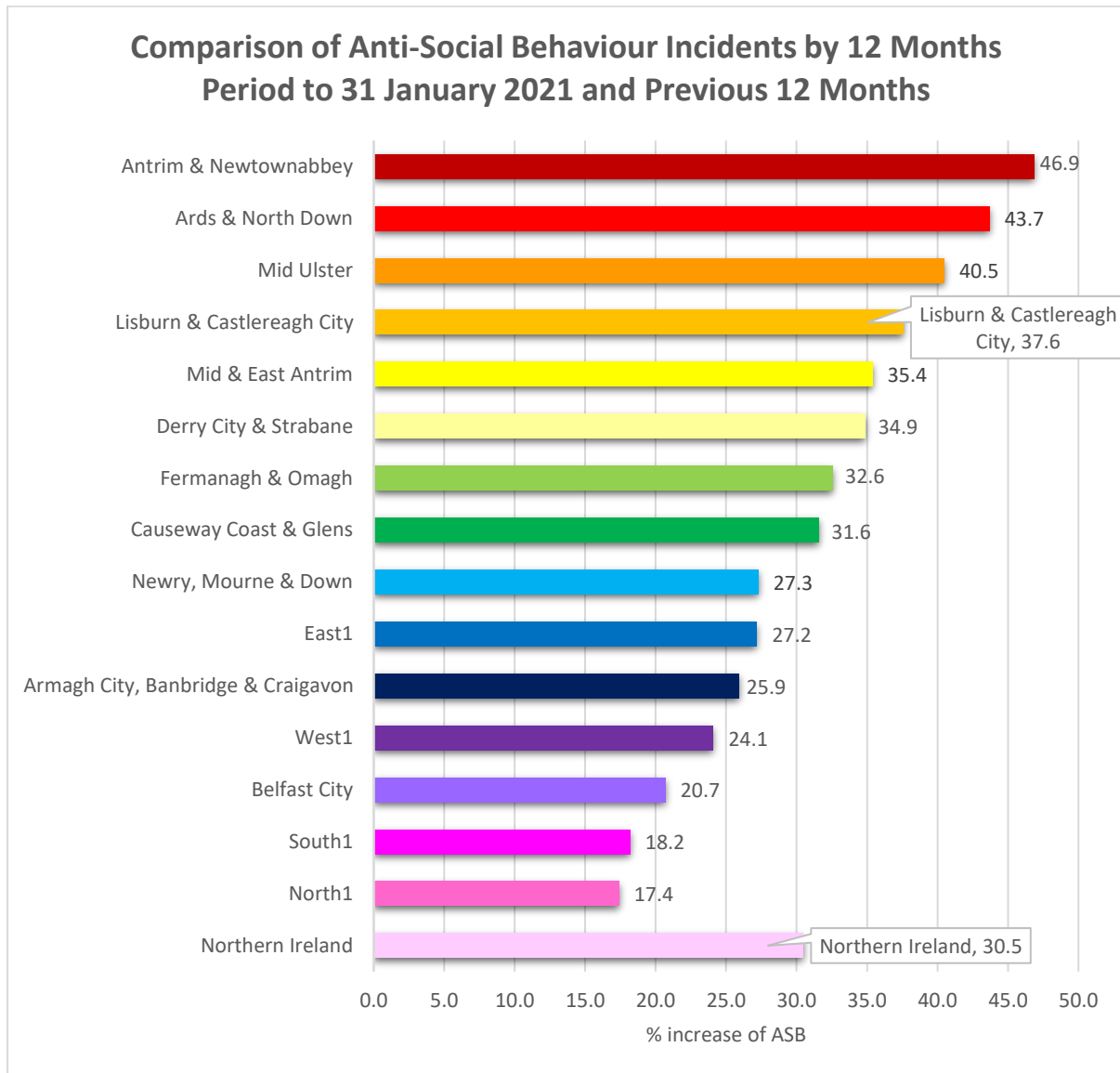
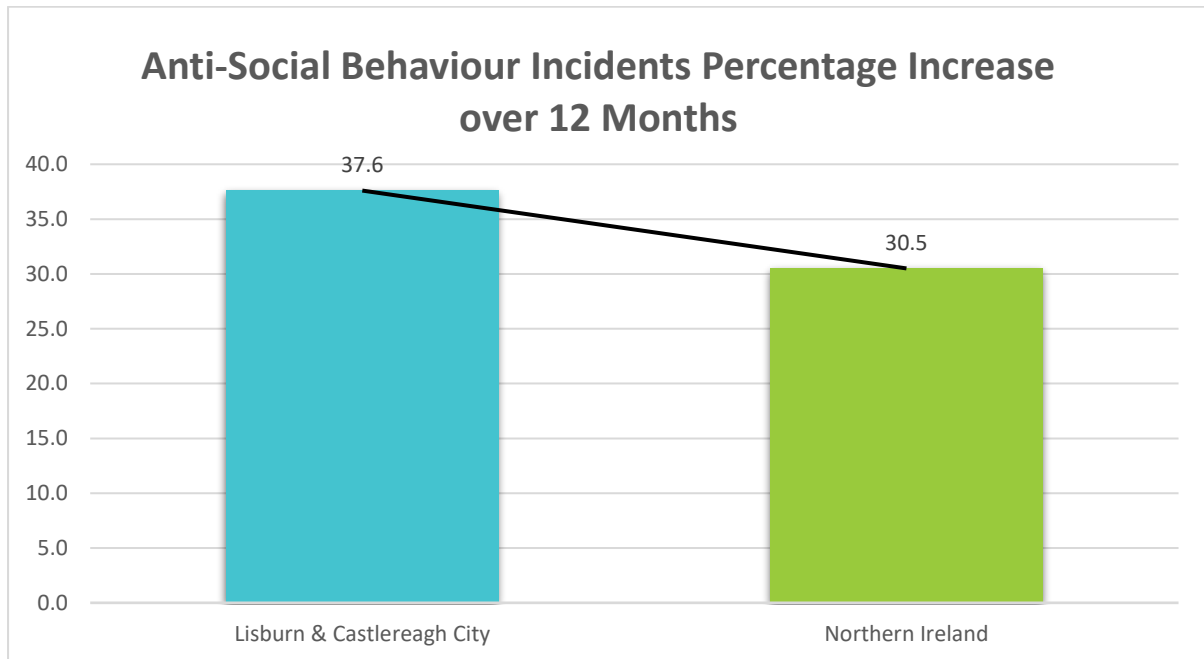

Chart 10 – Anti-Social Behaviour Incidents Percentage Increase over 12 Months – Local Government Districted Compared to NI



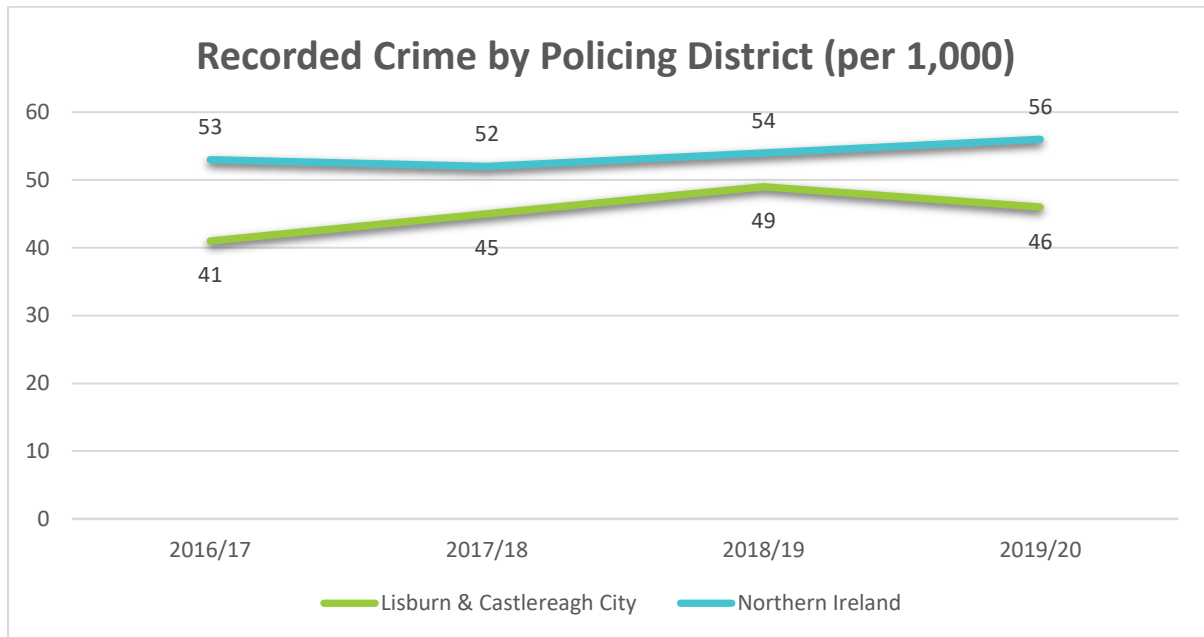

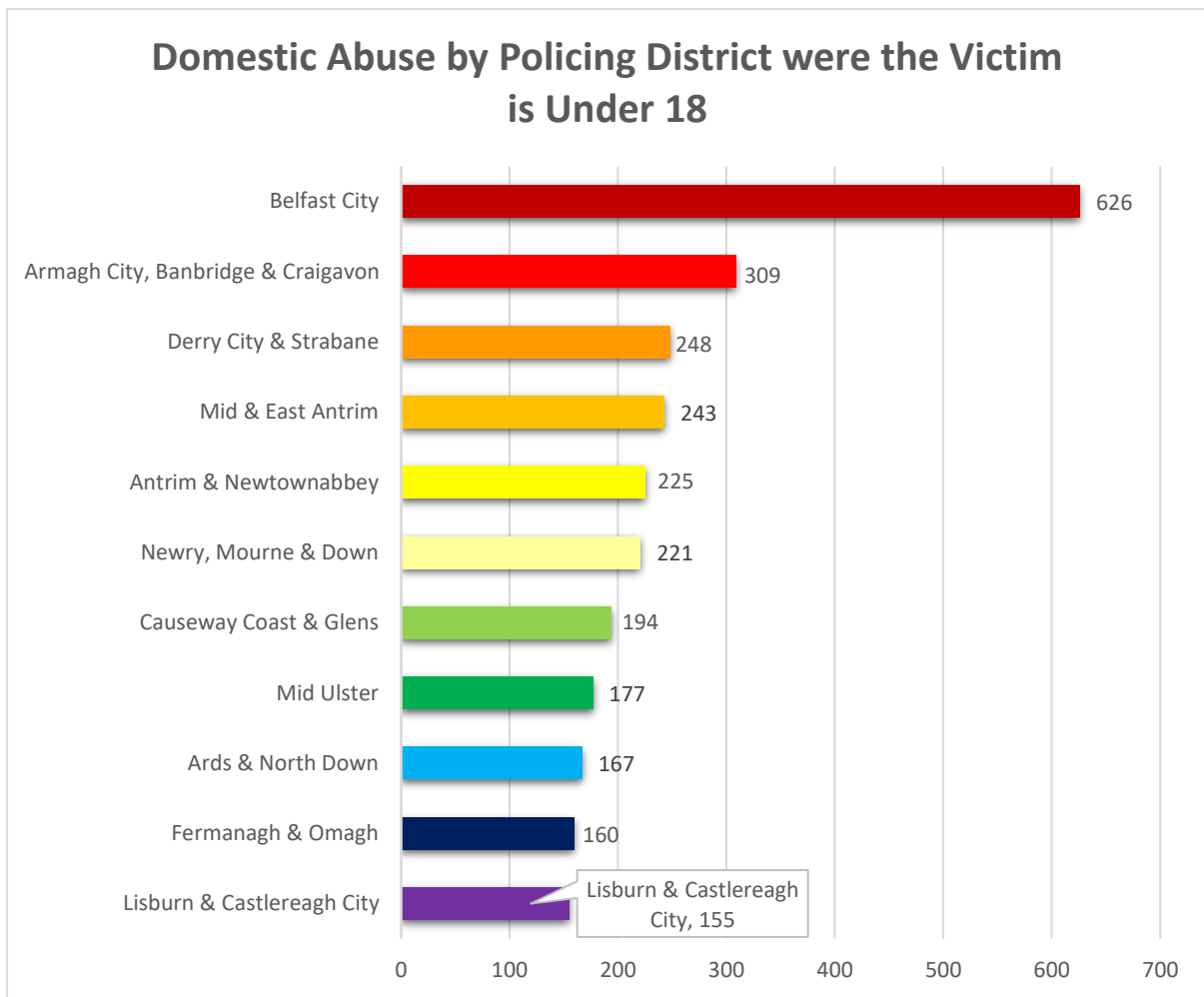

Chart 13 – Children Referred to Youth Justice System by Area of Residence (2019 – 20)

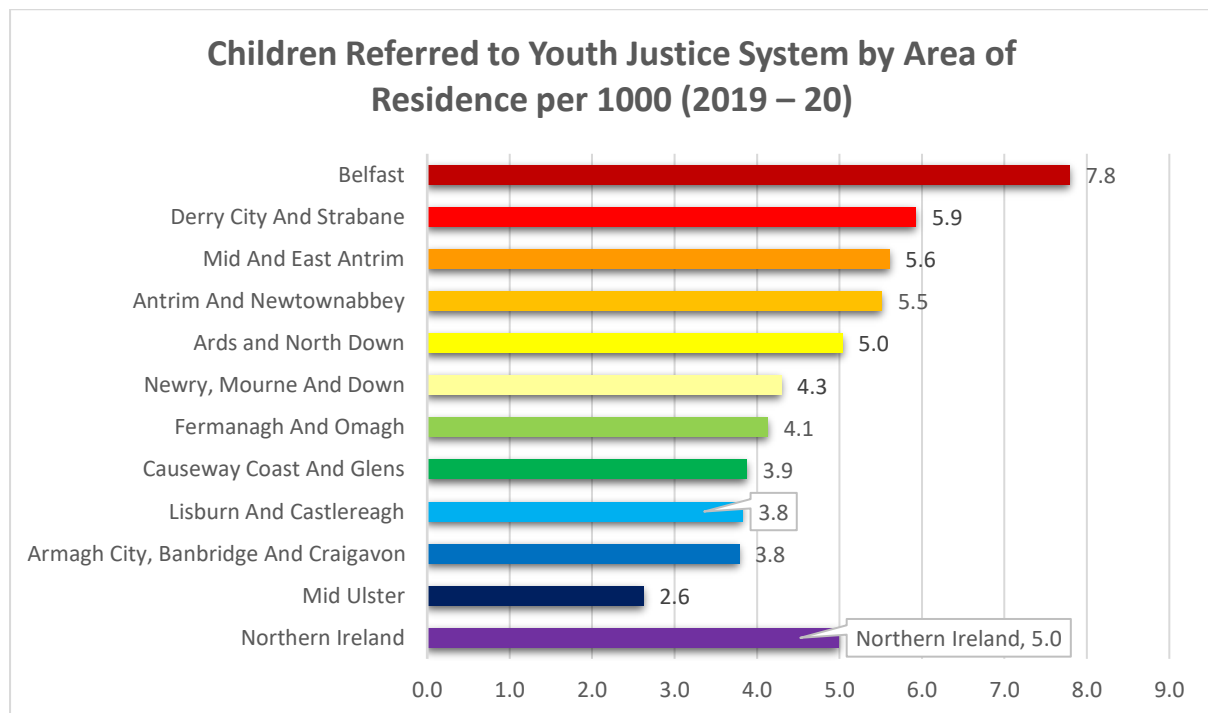

Chart 14 – Children Referred to Youth Justice by Gender

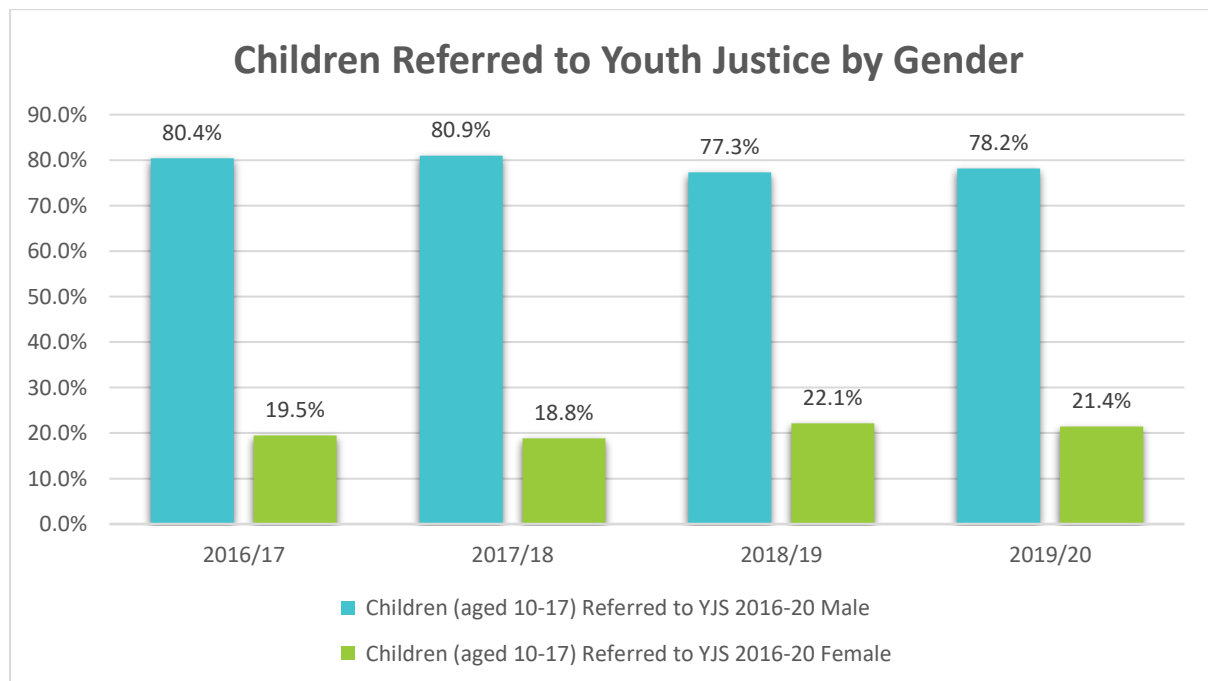

Chart 15 – Children Referred to Youth Justice by Age

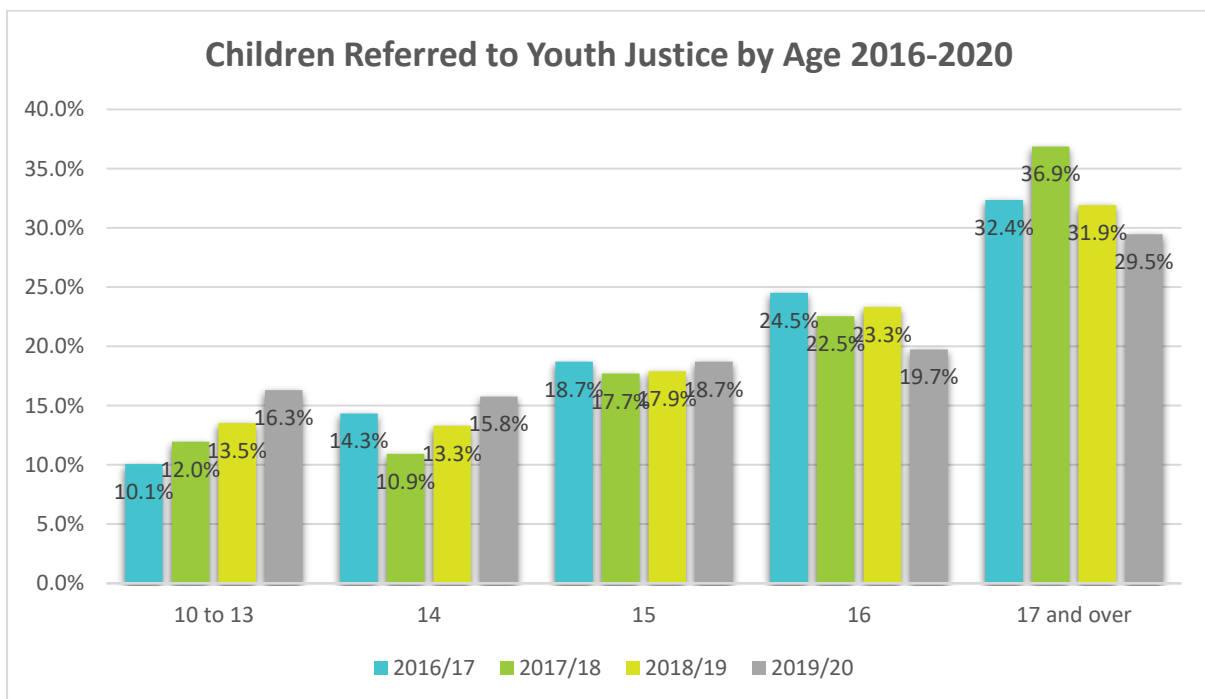

Chart 16 – Children Referred to Youth Justice by Religion

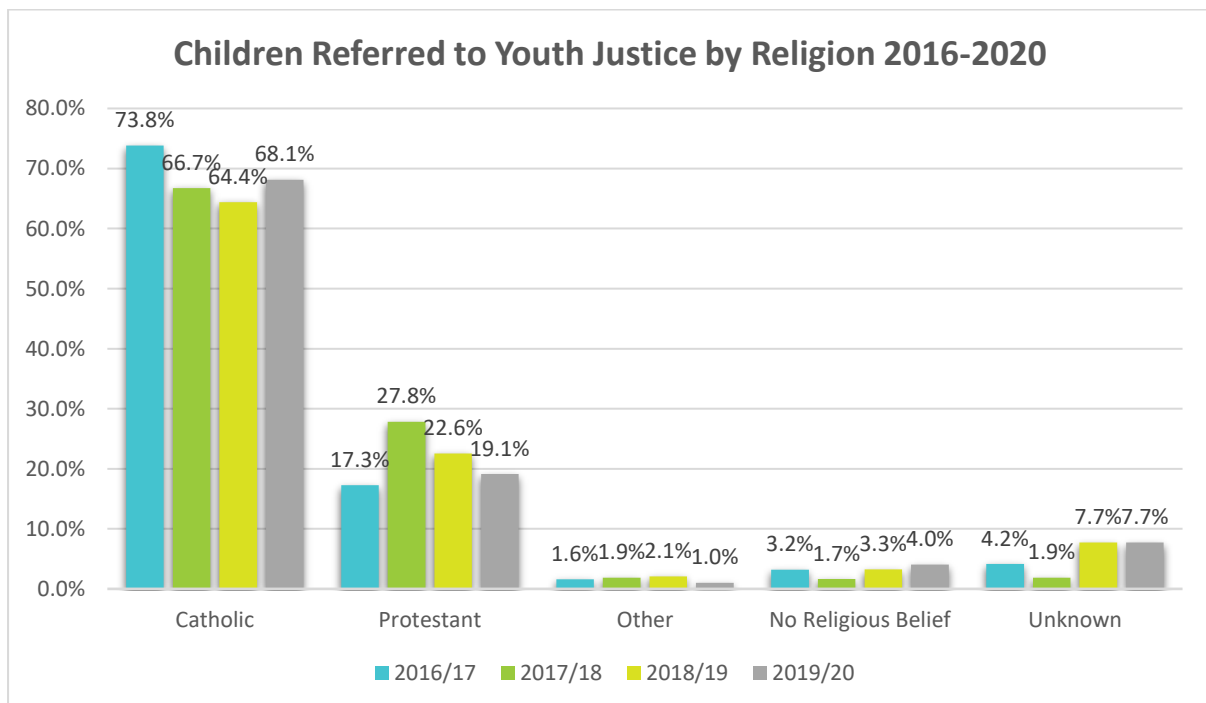
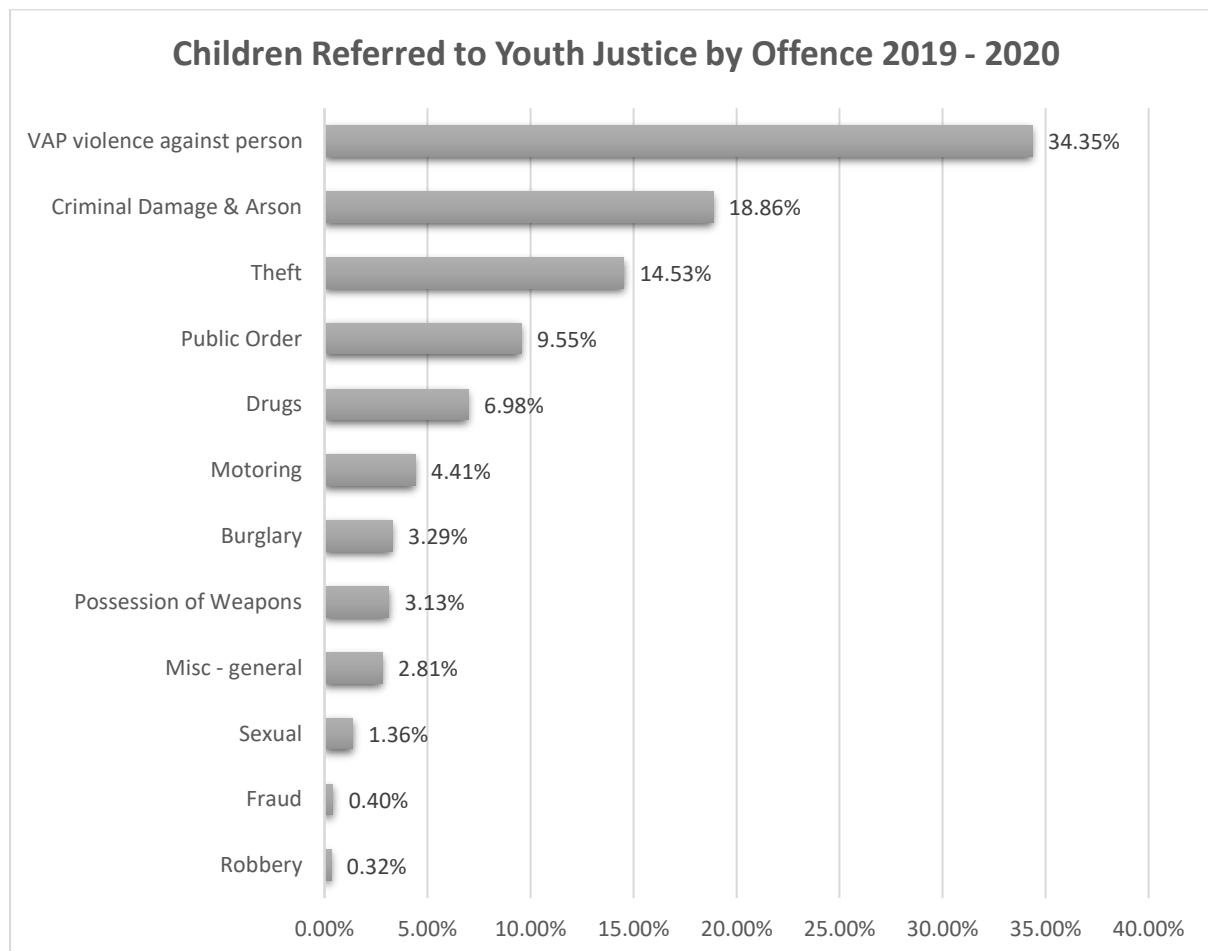

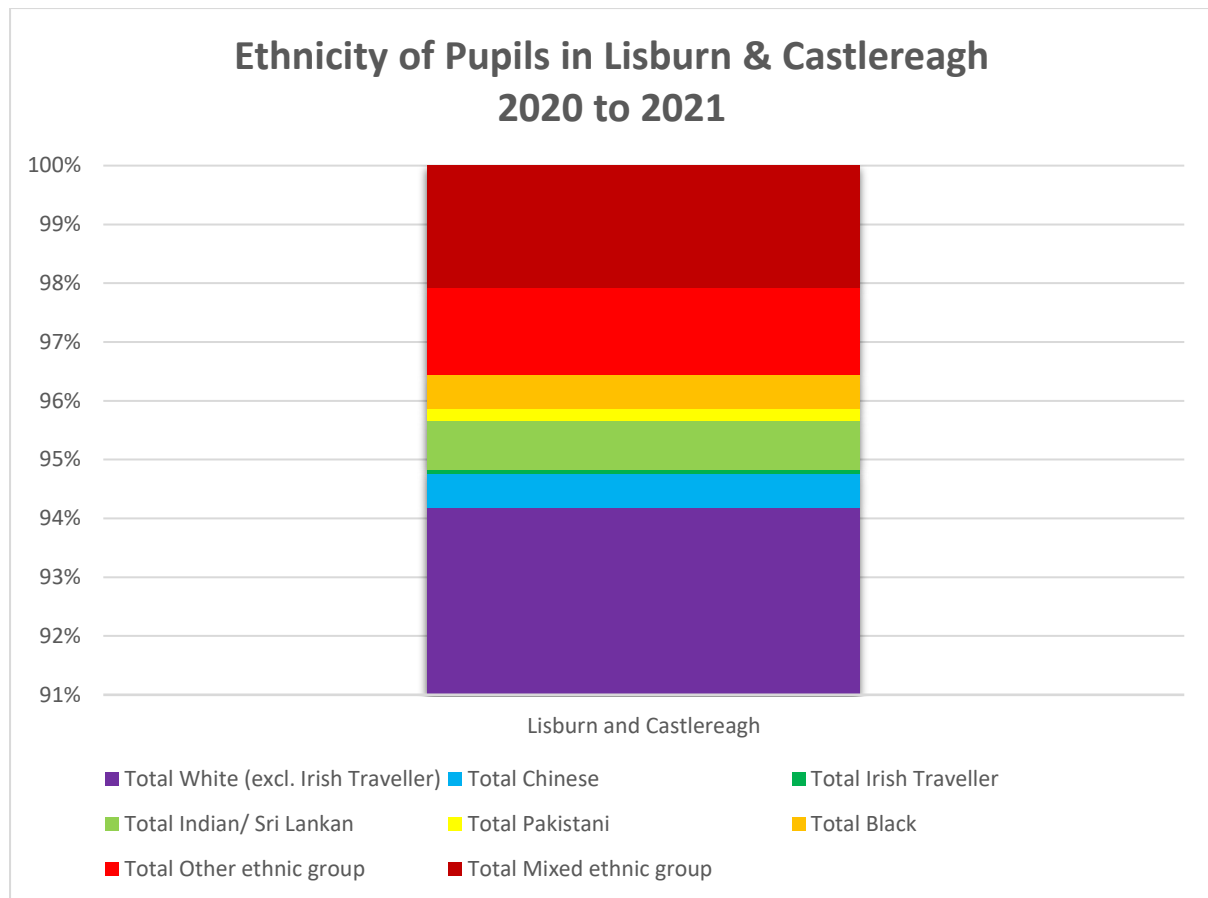

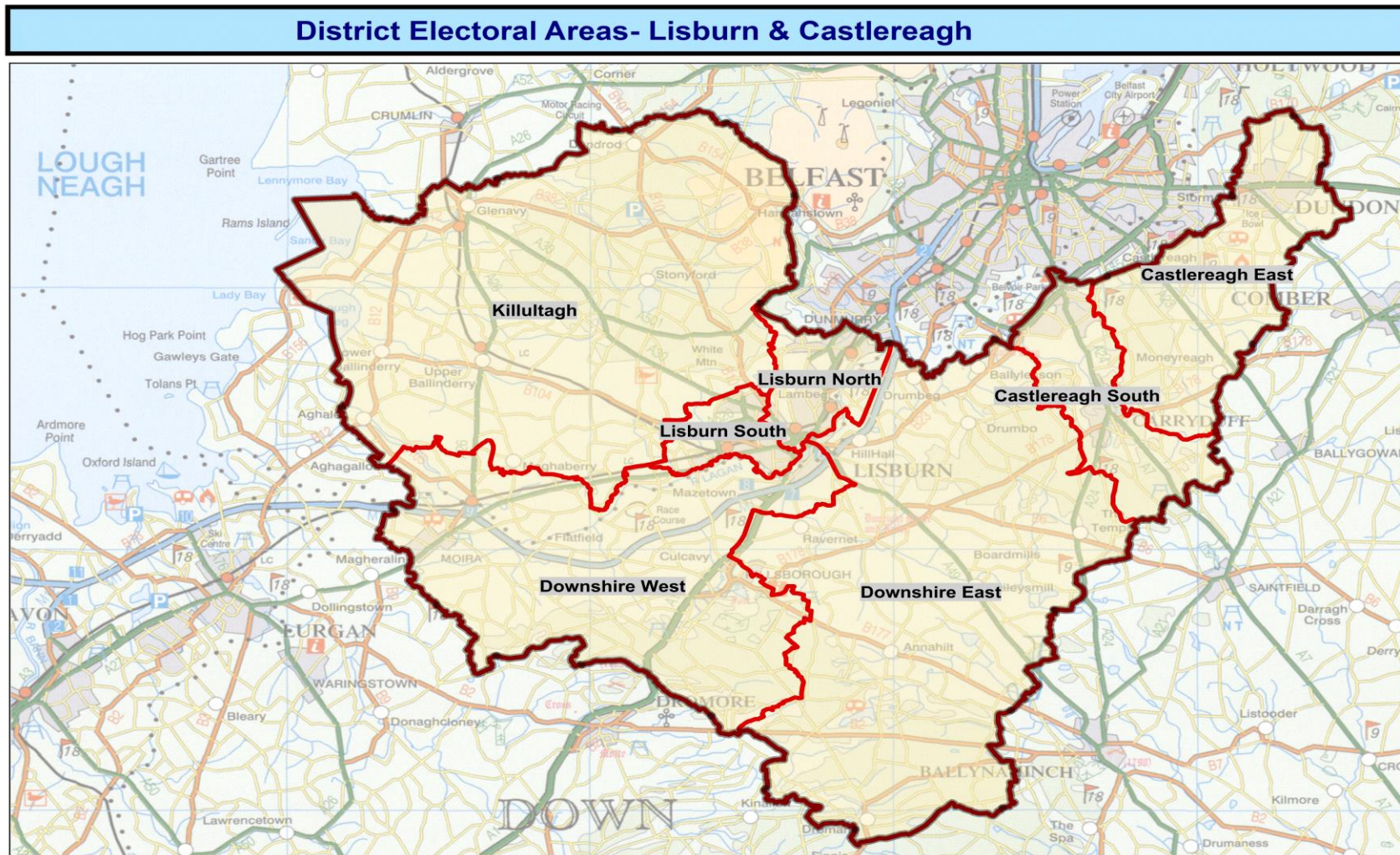




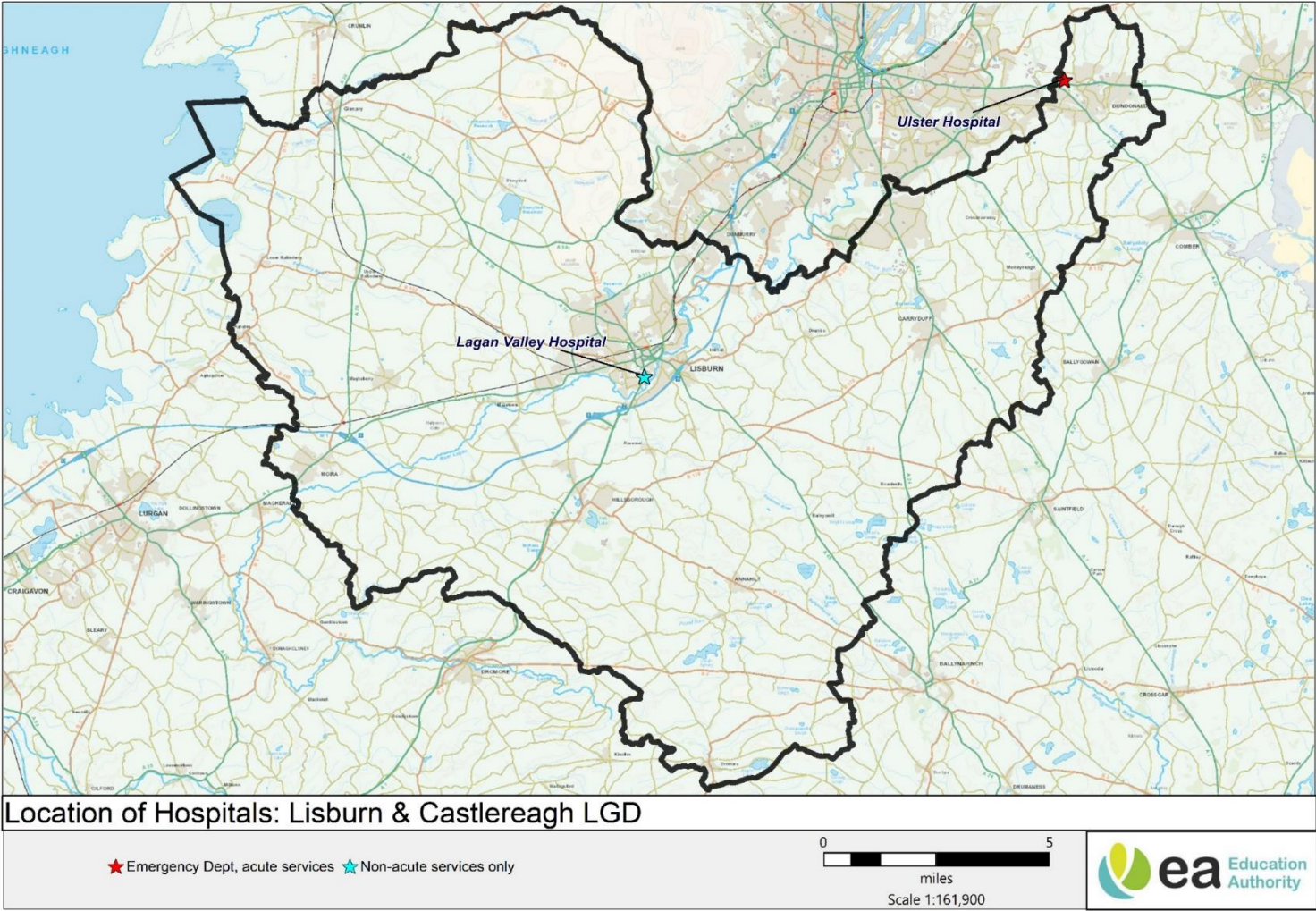

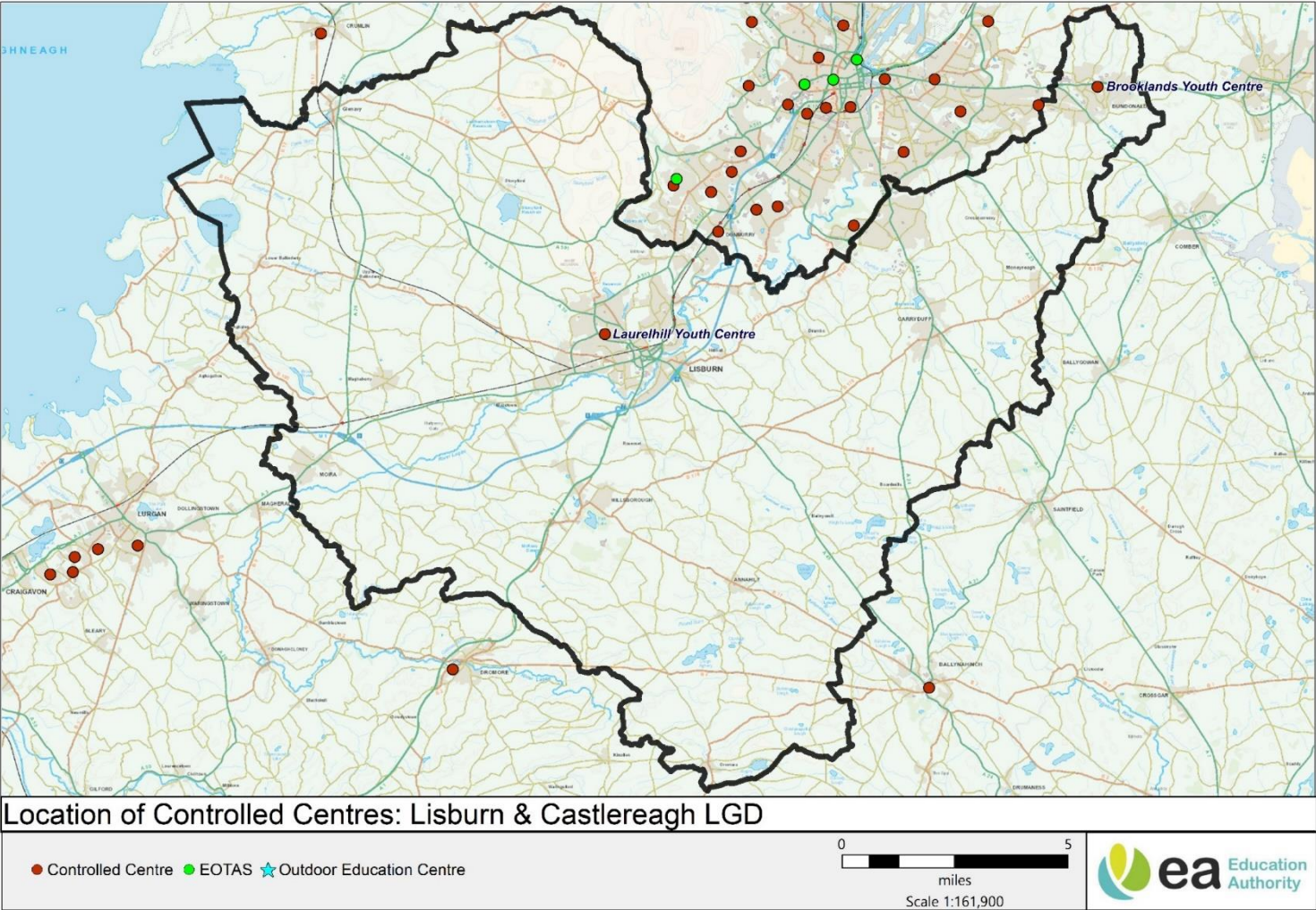
6.5 Map of District Electoral Areas in the Local Government District
