Local Youth Development Plan 2023-2026

INTRODUCTION

The purpose of this document is to provide an area plan for the delivery of youth services within the South and West Belfast Area. This local area youth work plan considers the Regional Assessment of Need and the key priorities identified for children and young people aged 4 to 25 years.

In addition to the <u>Regional Assessment of Need</u>, there has also been a <u>Local Assessment of Need</u> completed for this council area which involved significant stakeholder engagement locally to understand the bespoke needs of children and young people. This plan considers both the regional and local needs of children and young people and as such should be read in conjunction with both the Regional Assessment of Need and the Local Assessment of Need.

The Regional Youth Development Plan provides a comprehensive overview of the legislative context and the key policy drivers which determine the plan.

Managing Local Resources to Deliver on the Plan

The plan represents what children and young people have asked youth services to deliver to meet their needs. However, with the current budgetary uncertainty relating to funding of public services, the increased cost of living being experienced by families and communities, and as we continue to address the long-term impacts of covid-19; Youth Services will need to ensure there is priority focus regarding the use of resources to;

- Protect the delivery and availability of core youth provision for children and young people
- Provide targeted and continuous support to protect the most vulnerable children and young people who are engaging with youth services
- Consider additional funding from sources, external to Department of Education Youth Service Funding to effectively allocate resources based on need.

Governance and Reporting on The Plan

The Designated Senior Youth Officer for the Council area has lead responsibility for the implementation, delivery, and reporting on the progress of the plan in consultation with local stakeholders and the Local Advisory Group. The Plan will be reviewed regularly and updated based on the ongoing assessment of need of children and young people through continued stakeholder engagement, research, and availability of funding resources for the youth work sector in Northern Ireland.

The Local Youth Development Plan is delivered through grant aid assistance for EA Registered Voluntary Youth Organisations and by the EA Statutory Youth Service. It is important to note that partnership work is promoted and utilised where there are significant benefits to the outcomes of children and young people.

Specific targets for the statutory sector are included within the plan and youth work within schools is developed in conjunction with the EA School Development Service and in line with policy directives; where outcomes are assessed as needed and Youth Service is required to address barriers to learning within formal education settings.
