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Current Financial Context

In the continued absence of an Education Budget for this financial year there are estimated pressures of c£530m against the indicative baseline Education budget. Due to this uncertainty and the strong likelihood that there will be a significant overspend against the Education budget, the published funding opportunities released on the 25 November 2022 are prioritised based on assessed need.

The Education Authority's priority at this stage is to support and protect core youth services that will focus on providing safe spaces for children and young people. Anything that is added value or targeted is additional and will not be considered in this funding round until a budget position for 2023-2024 is established.

All funding opportunities released on the 25 November 2022 are subject to approval and budget availability.






All About the Funding Scheme

Regional Funding Streams





Up go £150,000 per year Up to 3 years funding

For Regional Voluntary Youth Organisations who support EA registered Local Voluntary Youth Organisations to bring about positive change to the quality of youth work they deliver. This will be based on assessed need and a strength-based approach to planning and delivery.

Regional Project



Up to £50,000 per year Up to 3 years funding

Is for support services to youth work organisations on key themes identified as needed for children and young people to include; supporting the educational attainment of children and young people, support for Section 75 groups and young people who live in rural areas.

Regional Development



Funding Dependent on the Opportunity

Is for the delivery of additional or enhanced key services identified as needed for example; development of research on key issues affecting young people.

Local Area Based



Up go £130,000 per year Up to 3 years funding

Is for EA registered Local Voluntary Youth Organisations who directly deliver in their local communities across Northern Ireland which includes the delivery of:

- Centre-Based Youth Work
- Area Based Youth Work
- Street Based Youth Work

Local Project



Up to £30,000 per year Up to 3 years funding

Is for EA registered Local Voluntary Youth Organisations who directly deliver youth work on key themes identified as needed for children and young people including; supporting educational attainment, support for Section 75 groups and young people who live in rural areas.

Generic/Non-Targeted



Based on hours delivered & average attendance Funded Annually


Is for EA registered Local Voluntary Youth Organisations whose provision is delivered by volunteers for example, uniformed organisations, church based organisations.



Application Forms, Process and Assessment

What do the Funding Application Forms and Process Look Like?





Regional Strategic

You are applying based on nominations by EA Registered Local Voluntary Youth Organisations at the point of application, which may be subject to registration verification.

If successful, this award value may be subject to change/review by your funding officer (increased or decreased award) at conditional offer stage based on verified nominations at that point. This will also include annual review throughout the period of the award and a review of proportionate mechanisms to support the allocation of funding to meet assessed need.







Feedback Received

- 1. The application process takes too long
- 2. Word Count restrictive
- 3. Delivery requirements were too prescriptive for Local Area Funding
- 4. Funding available was not clear
- 5. Regional Strategic Reporting process needs to be reviewed
- 6. The Moderation Framework isn't always applicable to the work funded

Changes Made

- 1. Streamlined application process; Single Stage applications and number of questions reduced
- 2. Word count increased
- 3. Now you propose the most effective delivery plan to meet the assessed needs in your area
- 4. Maximum Funding Available is now stated clearly on the Funding Opportunity, as well as incremental annual increases, where applicable.
- 5. Reporting for Regional Strategic has been revised no more Target Monitor for this Funding Stream or Regional Development.
- 6. The Moderation Framework is being revised before the 1st April
